From the Vice Chancellor's Desk



Greetings

It is my privilege to present to you the Annual Report for 2013-14 of the ICFAI Foundation for Higher Education, a Deemed-to-be University u/s 3 of the UGC Act, 1956. The report covers the activities for the period April 01, 2013, to March 31, 2014. This is IFHE's fifth full academic year of operations after it was declared as a Deemed-to-be-University in December 2008.

I am glad to inform you that the Business School of the University has been consistently ranked amongst the top twelve in India by Business India. It is one of the first three from South Asia to get the SAQS (South Asian Quality Systems) accreditation by AMDISA (Association of Management Development Institutions of South Asia). It was reaccredited by SAQS for another five years covering the period January 2013 to January 2018. Two of the country's leading rating agencies, CRISIL (part of Standard & Poor) and ICRA (Part of Moody's), have rated B- Schools. IBS Hyderabad has received a rating of A** at the national level and A*** at the state level from CRISIL. The grades indicate high academic standards. We received a grading of EB2 IN at the national level and EB2+AP at the state level from ICRA. The grade indicates that the institution has resources and processes that can deliver high quality management education. It has also been rated as an 'excellent' business school by Eduniversal, a ranking based on the perceptions of the Deans of 1000 B-Schools all over the world.

The cases developed by the University have won several international prizes. The business school has organized six International Conferences, at which more than 371 papers have been presented. One of them was the International Doctoral Theses Conference which was held for the sixth consecutive year and was held in collaboration with Broad College of Business, Michigan State University, East Lansing, USA. This Conference has benefited several doctoral scholars across the country in Management and Economics in terms of improving the quality of their PhD theses. The faculty members presented a number of papers at these conferences. The 2nd International Conference on Business Intelligence, Analytics and Knowledge Management (BIAKM-2013), was held in collaboration with Hongkong Polytechnic University (Poly U), Hongkong. The 10th International Conference on Business and Finance was held in partnership with Oklahoma State University, Finance Department, Oklahoma, USA in January, 2014.

Further, a jointly authored paper by Dr. Nasina Jigeesh and Mr. Samyadip Chakraborty was awarded the Best Research Paper under IT category at the Annual International Research Conference organized by Symbiosis Institute of Management Studies (SIMS), Pune, in December 2013. Also a paper titled "The mediating role of customer related performance outcome on the relationship between customer integration and firm performance: An investigation in Indian context" by Nikhat Afsan, Research scholar was awarded the second prize under Doctoral Track (certificate of excellence and a cash prize) in ISDSI (Indian Subcontinent Region Decision Sciences Institute) conference held at IMI, New Delhi, in December 2013.

The faculty members and research scholars have also published 193 papers in reputed journals, of which 43 are in journals listed in Scopus and 4 in A*/A journals listed in ABDC. Our faculty members also participated in a number of national and international conferences. The abstracts of some of the research publications by the faculty during the year 2013-14 are presented at the end of the report. The University now publishes eight journals in the area of management and one in law. The details are spelt out in the section on editorship of journals.

Several distinguished personalities have visited our campus. Their inspiring lectures have served to professionally enrich our students and faculty. These eminent visitors include Suresh Sundaresan, Chase Manhattan Bank Professor of Economics and Finance, Columbia Business School, USA; Kavil Ramachandran, Thomas Schmidheiny Chair of Family Business and Wealth Management, ISB, Hyderabad; Dr. D.N. Reddy, Member, University Grants Commission and Chairman, Recrutiment and Assesment Centre, DRDO, Prof. R. Radhakrishna Chairman and Hon. Professor at the Centre for Economic and Social Studies, Hyderabad and a former Chairman of the National Statistical Commission, A. V. Muthukrishna, HKUST Business School, Hong Kong; I.M. Pandey, Professor of Research, IIM Lucknow and others.

The second NJ Yasaswy Commemoration Lecture was delivered by Prof Kavil Ramachandran, Thomas Schmidheiny Chair of Family Business and Wealth Management, ISB, Hyderabad, on the topic 'Institution Building: Challenges, Experiences and Learnings' on October 8, 2013.

The Fourth Convocation of the University was held on July 7, 2014. The chief guest was Prof Abhijit Sen, Professor, Jawaharlal Nehru University (JNU), New Delhi, Former Member of Planning Commission, and Member, Fourteenth Finance Commission. The Convocation was presided over by the Chancellor Dr. C H Hanumantha Rao. In all, 16 PhD degrees, 990 MBA degrees, 60 BBA degrees, and 151 B.Tech degrees were conferred at this graduating ceremony.

The details of my endorsements stated herein and various other activities can be found in the following pages under various categories.

The financials of the University in terms of funding, operations, income, and expenditure are fairly good and well managed by a team of experienced and qualified finance personnel.

I wish to express my deep sense of gratitude to the UGC and the Ministry of Human Resource Development of the Government of India for their constant support in the management of our institution. We have benefited immensely from the vision of our Chancellor Dr. C H Hanumantha Rao, to whom we are grateful. 1. Introduction

The ICFAI Foundation for Higher Education (IFHE), a registered Trust, was established by the Institute of Chartered Financial Analysts of India (ICFAI), Hyderabad, a not-for-profit educational society registered in 1984 under the Andhra Pradesh (Telangana Area) Public Societies Registration Act, 1350F (Act 1 of 1350F), with the main objective of imparting high quality education. The IFHE was declared as a Deemed-to-be University under Section 3 of the UGC Act, 1956, in December 2008, with IBS Hyderabad as its constituent. During the year 2010-11, the UGC, vide its Notification No. F.6-42/2005(CPP-I) dated May 26, 2010, granted approval for the starting of the Faculty of Science & Technology and the Faculty of Law in the University's campus. In its fifth full year of operations, the University has been growing from strength to strength by virtue of the dedicated efforts of the faculty, support staff, and students to achieve innovation and excellence.

2. Vision: Merit with Ethics

The vision of IFHE is to emerge as a "Research and Teaching University" and to ensure that the students acquire a holistic approach which, when coupled with inner merit, will transform them into citizens with vision, a deep sense of ethics, and social responsibility.

Mission: Learning for Leadership



Accreditations

AACSB Accreditation

We have completed the first step in AACSB (The Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business, HQ, Florida, (USA) accreditation. The Eligibility application has been approved and Prof. Colm Kearney, Dean, Monash University, Melbourne, Australia has been appointed as a mentor. The next step is submission of the Standards Alignment Plan. The work related to the same will be started shortly.

Rankings

The World Consulting & Research Corporation (WCRC)–Asian Edition has ranked IBS Hyderabad, IFHE, among the Asia's Best Private Educational Institutions for the year 2012-13, as selected by KPMG. We were presented the Award on Jan 09, 2014, at New Delhi. SPJIMR, MDI & Symbiosis were the other B-Schools along with us. ISB, XLRI, INSEAD (Singapore), AIM (Manila) and NUS (Singapore) were awarded earlier.

Silicon India, a Bangalore based magazine ranked IBS, Hyderabad as Second in their All India Ranking of Business schools-2014. The ranking is for Non-IIM Business Schools.

5. Infrastructure and Learning Resources

The University is endowed with excellent facilities required for creating a congenial academic atmosphere. State-ofthe-art infrastructure is available at IFHE to meet the requirements of the programs conducted.

a. Academic Complex: The entire academic area at IFHE Hyderabad including FOM, FST, and FOL, consisting of more than 15 lakh sq.ft of built-up area, is centrally air-conditioned, networked on LAN and WiFi, and supported with audio and projector facilities.

In addition to these, there are 150 faculty rooms, meeting rooms, administrative offices, academics office, student support services office, career management center, etc. The entire academic area is networked with internet connectivity of a very high bandwidth (185 MBPS).

b. Hostels: The University offers hostel facilities for 2000 boys with single and dual sharing accommodation with 24 hours hot water through solar energy and regular water for their use. RO plants provide drinking water, which is made available in the hostels through water coolers. The hostel complexes are networked with 24hour internet facility and are furnished with TVs, washing machines, water dispensers, etc.

- Separate hostels are available for 1200 girl students. Both the boys and girls hostels are provided with late night cafés for the use of the students during odd hours.
- Two separate dining complexes with eight dining halls are provided. These are fully equipped with modern kitchen equipment. Each dining complex has the capacity to seat 700 students at one time.

c. Faculty Accommodation: Residential quarters are available for 75 faculty members. These comprise D type accommodation measuring 850 Sq ft, C type measuring 1100 Sq ft, B type measuring 1600 Sq ft, and A type measuring 2100 Sq ft.

d. Administrative Office: The administrative office looks after security and safety and the maintenance of the premises and equipment. It acquires physical resources and organizes events, seminars, and conferences. It also provides support to the academics office for the conduct of classes, examinations, and other academic processes.

It ensures that all facilities and equipment are working and they are repaired immediately. The administrative staff maintains records of utilization of facilities and submits a monthly report to the head of the campus on usage of facilities and equipment. Maintenance of critical equipment is contracted to the manufacturers of the equipment.

e. Accounts Office: The accounts office deals with financial matters. It collects fees from the students, pays them scholarships, pays the bills for goods and services purchased by the University, and operates bank accounts. The accounts office is headed by an accounts officer and is supported by assistants. The accounts office is provided with computers with accounting software. Most of the accounting operations at IFHE are computerized.

f. Clinic: The University has a two bedded clinic manned by four full-time doctors with a Resident Medical Officer available 24x7 on the Campus. The doctors attend to the basic health needs of the students, the faculty, and the staff of IFHE. The clinic has basic medical equipment and supporting facilities and equipment. For referral as well as major health issues, IFHE has arrangements with corporate hospitals. For medical emergencies, two ambulances with four drivers are available round the clock. The doctors are provided with a PC and telephone for monitoring the health of the students and to communicate with their parents, if necessary. They maintain a database of all the cases which helps them to access the medical history of the students when they come for a subsequent visit.

g. Cafeteria: The IFHE campus has two cafeterias that function during the day time for the use of faculty, staff, and students and three cafeterias exclusively for the students in the odd hours (late night). The cafeterias provide snacks, coffee/tea, and aerated drinks. They also offer catering services for conferences, meetings, and seminars organized on the campus. The campus has two messes for the use of students, faculty, staff and others who visit our campus. At a time 1600 Students, faculty, staff can make use of the mess facilities, where, breakfast, lunch and dinner are made available.

h. Games & Sports Equipment: IFHE also has a Common Recreation Room where students and staff can meet and



play indoor games. The recreation rooms are equipped with chess boards, carrom boards, table tennis, and separate gyms for boys and girls. The indoor stadium has facilities for squash and badminton.

IFHE also has equipment for outdoor games. Kits for cricket, football, volleyball, basketball, tennis, and badminton are available. The students are provided sports equipment when they organize inter-class/intercollege competitions. There is a swimming pool of national standards with lifeguards standing by. These facilities are for the use of students, faculty, and staff.

i. Photocopying and Printing Facilities: FHE provides photocopying and printing facilities both for the students and for the faculty and staff. A separate facility is provided for the students within the hostels. Similarly, students and the faculty also have access to document scanning and CD writing facilities.

j. Intranet: IFHE, with its Wi-Fi enabled campus, uses IT in a big way. It uses IT for planning and dissemination of information. In the last few months, it has developed an Intranet that is helping it organize its operations more effectively and efficiently. The Intranet is helping to provide better services to students and in better utilization of the University's resources.

k. IT facilities: IFHE places great emphasis on the use of IT for teaching and in its operations. Consequently, it has deployed modern IT hardware and software on its campus. Keeping the rapid obsolescence in IT hardware, software, and technologies in mind, IFHE constantly upgrades its IT infrastructure.

The IFHE campus has added one computer lab during the year. The faculty uses the computing facilities for teaching and research, while the staff uses IT for enhancing the productivity of their operations and providing superior service to the students, faculty, and other staff members.

The computers on the IFHE campus are networked and have e-mail and Intranet facilities. The computers provided to the faculty and staff have been provided with standard office productivity software.

I. Computing Facilities: The University has more than 875 personal computers — most of them with Pentium 4 processors — and servers of HP, IBM, & SUN make. The other hardware in the computer centers of the IFHE campus include CD Writers, Backup DAT Drives, Data Modems, Scanners, DeskJet Printers, Network Printers, and LaserJet Printers.

The operating systems used on the IFHE campus are Windows 2000, Windows 2003, Windows XP, Windows 2000 Professional, Red Hat Linux 9, and Solaris 5.0.

The application software available on the IFHE campus includes Office XP, Office 2000, Office 2003, Acrobat Reader 6.0, WinZip 8.0, FrontPage 2003, Turbo c/c++, JAVA 2.0, Visual Basic 6.0, Oracle 8i server and client, SQL Server and client, IBM DB2, IBM web sphere, Adobe Photoshop, Adobe Page Maker, Macro Media Flash, Oracle ERP application server, Tally, and Focus. IFHE also has statistical/simulation software tools like Prowess, ARENA, SPSS, Rational Rose, and Lisrel, which students



and faculty use for their research and analysis work.

Students, faculty, and staff are given access to the computing facilities for 15 hours a day. IFHE has academic alliances with several computer software companies like Microsoft Corporation, IBM, SAS Institute, Oracle Corporation, PeopleSoft, Microworld, Micromedia Corporation, and Adobe.

m. Energy: **Generator:** TThe University has full power supply from the public utility services as well as two generators with complete back-up facility of more than 2000 KVA.

Usage of Solar Energy: Solar panels, installed at various places within the campus, are used to power Solar Water Heaters. The entire hot water requirement in the hostels and mess is met through these solar water heaters.

Conservation of Power: The Academic blocks and libraries are planned architecturally to get natural light during the daytime and are well illuminated. This has ensured that there is no wastage of power.

n. Water Supply: The University has water supply from the Hyderabad Metro water supply department as well as a back-up of underground water resource through 10 bore wells and a sump to store 4,00,000 liters of water to be used at any time on the campus.

Reverse Osmosis (RO) Water Treatment: The underground water is treated in the RO plant to make it potable for drinking.

Sewerage Treatment Plant (STP): The sewerage is treated and used for irrigation purposes for the green vegetation on the campus. The University has a Sewerage Treament Plant which has been upgraded to treat 950 KLD for waste water treatment. This water is used for watering the plants on the campus.

6. Biodiversity

The campus has a total area of 92 acres. About 70% of the area (65 acres) is devoted to biological diversity with 55% for flora and grass, 10% for fauna, and 5% for human beings. They co-exist in a happy and symbiotic relationship. Infrastructure and buildings account for 20%; roads and green pathways constitute 5%; and another 5% is for grounds and facilities (for sports and recreation).



7. Learning Resources

The University has a central library and two departmental libraries attached to the Faculty of Science & Technology and the Faculty of Law. The spacious central library, which is spread over three floors, is named as the Sri N J Yasaswy Memorial Library. It has a carpet area of 50,500 sq.ft and is centrally air conditioned. The library has a seating capacity of 700.

The library has a diverse collection of books, CD/DVDs, reports, and national/international periodicals related to all functional areas of management, economics, science & technology, and law. All the library activities are computerized with the help of Libsuite, the integrated library management software. The library documents are classified according to the Dewey decimal classification system. An online catalogue is maintained. This helps the students, faculty, and staff to trace books easily. All the documents are bar-coded and bar-coded identity cards are issued to the users (students, faculty & staff) for borrowing the documents.

The library also subscribes to several online databases such as Ebsco, Emerald, Science Direct, and Proquest, to enable the users to access these databases as well as the library catalogue (Webopac) through the campus intranet. Photocopying facilities are also available within the library premises.

Research related software like SPSS & SAS are made available to the scholars and faculty. Research related books, monographs, and dissertations / theses are housed in the reference section. The latest books and revised editions in the related fields are procured every month keeping in view future requirements.

The library staff is professionally qualified and experienced

and maintains the library efficiently, catering to the needs of the users.

Upgradation of Infrastructure: TheUniversity uses both formal and informal methods to get to know the kind of infrastructural facilities that it needs to add or upgrade. Some of the facilities are directly managed by the faculty and hence the campus head comes to know about the facility requirements. Students are also involved in managing facilities like the library, computer centers, and cafeteria. Hence, they too form an important source of feedback.

Visits by the faculty/center head to other educational institutions are encouraged. These visits provide insights about the facilities and equipment that these institutions use. The Director also encourages manufacturers and dealers of equipment to demonstrate their products.

Monitoring Mechanism

The University also has a formal mechanism to get feedback from the faculty, staff, and students on the infrastructure and facilities. Before the students graduate, detailed feedback is taken from all of them. This feedback is on computer facilities, library, cafeteria, their timings, etc. The head of academics also takes formal feedback from the faculty at the end of each semester about the facilities, equipment, hardware, and software requirements.

New Technology Infrastructure

The University has Wi-Fi connectivity on the campus. Students have the option of using the internet anywhere on the campus. The IT lab is equipped with the latest software and hardware. The institute has 185 mbps internet bandwidth for the use of students and faculty members. The internet facility has been provided to all the students for their academic and research work. Computers are provided to all the teaching staff in their rooms. Research related software such as SPSS, SAS, IBM Rational Rose etc., is available.

Automation Process

The current status of the automation initiative at the University is as follows:

- i. Admissions process where students have the facility to fill up the application online. Their identity cards for taking the written examination are also sent online. After the examination, their results are declared online and further communication is sent to them online.
- ii. Students' Feedback on faculty: The students have the facility to give their feedback on their respective faculty members online at the end of every semester.
- iii. Summer Internship Program (SIP) and Management Research Project (MRP) Evaluation: The faculty have the facility to evaluate the students at various intervals during the SIP and the MRP and can enter the marks for the students online.
- iv. Hosting Suggested Answers on the website: The question papers along with the suggested answers are uploaded on the site immediately after the examination is over. If a student has any doubts he/ she can immediately get them cleared by the faculty member concerned.
- v. University alumni activities like placement support, career enhancement support, alumni meetings, exchange of information, etc., are web enabled to ensure wider reach and faster processing.
- vi. Other activities online: The student circulars, office circulars, etc., are uploaded for student and faculty viewing.
- vii. Many other facilities like a site for the faculty where they can chat online regularly and exchange views, and an online facility for internal evaluation marks, etc., are in the process of being set up.
- viii. The biometric system of attendance recording for faculty and staff was implemented during the year.



Networking

Till recently, the students, staff, and faculty were using the network only for sharing resources like software and printers. In the last few months, the Academics Office, which keeps all the records and manages the MBA program, has created an Intranet to provide detailed and the latest information to the students and the faculty. The Intranet provides information on schedules of classes, examinations and events, syllabuses of courses, information about students and faculty, etc. It is being used by the students to communicate with each other, run opinion polls, post articles and news about the campus, and create a market to buy and sell items. Some of the salient features of the Intranet are as follows:

Using the Intranet, students can choose elective courses online. If a course is not offered because only a few students were interested in it, the software does not allow students to choose that course. Similarly, the software does not allow students to choose courses for which they are not eligible. IFHE uses the Learning Management System (LMS) to enhance the learning experience of students using the latest educational technology. All academic activities including evaluation are done using this facility, which is supported by Wi-Fi and advanced IT labs.

The Intranet has a link to the library database. The students and faculty can check the availability of books in the library.

The University has various academic, cultural, and social clubs. Each club has its own website. The clubs use the websites to announce the activities, events, and competitions organized by them; to get nominations for competitions; and to announce the results of the competitions. After an event is over, students upload photographs of the event and put up a report about the event.



8 Faculties and Programs

8.1 The Faculty of Management – IBSHyderabad

IFHE, Hyderabad, offers high-quality programs in Management, Science & Technology, and Law. The programs offered by IBS Hyderabad are BBA, MBA, and PhD (Full time & Part Time).

The BBA Program

The University launched the BBA program in the year 2010. In the fourth batch, i.e. the Class of 2013-16, there are 150 students.

The MBA Program

The MBA Program equips the students with the skills, knowledge, and strategic perspectives essential for leadership of business around the world. IBS Hyderabad has adopted the case-based learning method.

Management case studies form an integral part of the curriculum in leading B-schools globally. Case studies describe the situation faced by practicing managers in narrative form and also provide the necessary supporting information to involve students in the decision-making process. These case studies encourage students to think of the possible ways of handling such issues and help them learn the complexities of decision-making in business. The case studies also make them aware of the challenges that managers face every day at work. Almost all the courses in IBS are designed keeping in mind the advantages of case-based teaching. Each topic in a particular course is mapped with business cases. More than 400 different cases are studied, analyzed, and discussed by the students.

Summer Internship Program (SIP)

The Summer Internship Program (SIP) forms an important component of the MBA Program. It is an attempt to bridge the gap in the students' perception between academics and the corporate world. Under this program, students undertake a 12-week internship at any organization during the intervening period between close of Semester II and commencement of Semester III. It requires students to undergo the rigors of a professional environment, both in form and substance. SIP exposes the students to technical skills and helps them to acquire social skills by drawing them into contact with real professionals. The internship is a simulation of the real work environment. Students are guided by a faculty member from the IBS Hyderabad and from the company executive under whom the students undergo internship. Both will assess the performance of the student and will grade the students as Excellent, Very Good and Good. Students have undertaken the internship program in about 340 companies spread across 40 Indian cities.

Merit Scholarships


The University encourages students by awarding scholarships and Gold and Silver medals to meritorious students. During the academic year 2013-14, IBS Hyderabad granted approximately Rs.40.00 lakh toward Campus Merit Scholarships (MBA Program) to the top 10% of students. Similarly, for the BBA students, it granted about Rs.3.50 lakh as scholarships to the top 10% of the students. The Faculty of Science and Technology granted Merit Scholarships to the tune of Rs.32.80 lakh and the Faculty of Law Rs.2.20 lakh.

The PhD Program

The PhD program is a full-time, campus-based program designed for students interested in management teaching, research, and consultancy. The PhD program is unique and rigorous. It is modeled on the lines of the PhD programs offered by American universities, with the best practices of Indian universities blended in. The main objectives of the program are to:

- Develop management teachers well equipped with the skills required to impart education to business school students.
- Develop bright young academicians with research skills to conduct research in contemporary issues in management.

The program has five phases: Doctoral Coursework, Pedagogy, Qualifying Examination, Preparation of Research Proposal, and Thesis Work. It can be completed in four years. At present, there are 60 doctoral scholars pursuing their research in disciplines of their choice as mentioned here:

8.1.1 Economics

The Department of Economics has 12 faculty members. Eleven members have PhD degrees. They have an average of ten years of teaching experience. The Department offers courses in MBA, BBA, BBA-LLB, and PhD programs aimed at providing a broad understanding of the economic and business environment with emphasis on their relevance to managers and corporates. The faculty members are involved in teaching courses in the areas of Economics, Finance, and Entrepreneurship Development across the programs and in supervising students in the Summer Internship Programs. The Department is also actively engaged in research, management development programs, consulting, organizing conferences, seminars and guest lectures.

The faculty members are also involved in guiding PhD scholars, publishing papers in peer-reviewed national and international journals and publishing cases, books and edited books. The Department brings out a peer-reviewed journal titled 'IUP Journal of Applied Economics' which has an acceptance rate of 20 per cent. Some of the faculty members of the Department are also engaged as consulting editors and advisory board members for journals of other publishers.

During the academic year 2013-14, the Department contributed 13 research papers in national and international journals. One of the faculty members has also contributed a chapter in a reputed textbook.

Seven faculty members made paper presentations at national and international conferences of repute. The Department conducted five faculty seminars on diverse topics. The focus areas of research were financial economics, environmental sustainability, international trade, rural credit and development.

The Department is planning to launch a PhD program in Economics in the academic year 2014-15.

The Department organized the 6th International Doctoral Theses Conference on April 26-27, 2013 in collaboration with the Broad College of Business, Michigan State University, USA. Sixty two research papers by doctoral students from across the country and abroad were presented in fifteen different tracks during the twoday conference. Out of which 7 papers were presented by faculty members and research scholars from IBS Hyderabad. Prof. Sanjay Kallapur, Senior Associate Dean, Faculty & Research at the Indian School of Business, Hyderabad was the Chief Guest for the function. Prof. Vallabh Sambamurthy, the Eli Broad Professor and Chair of Department of Accounting and Information Systems at Broad College of Management, Michigan State University, USA delivered the keynote address through Skype. The second day of the conference included a workshop on advanced research methodology, focusing on Structural Equation Modeling. Dr. Santosh Madiraju, the Group Manager-HR of Microsoft India was the Guest of Honor in the valedictory session of the two-day Conference.

The department organized the Fourth International Conference on Applied Econometrics (ICAE-IV) in collaboration with The Indian Econometric Society, New Delhi which was held on March 20 – 21, 2014. The Chief Guest for the inaugural session was eminent economist, Prof. R. Radhakrishna who is the Chairman and Hon. Professor at the Centre for Economic and Social Studies, Hyderabad and a former Chairman of the National Statistical Commission. Prof. J. Mahender Reddy, the Vice-Chancellor of the University, presided over the session.

In his inaugural address on 'Scientific and Statistical Methods', citing several research papers, Prof R Radhakrishna spoke about how the accumulation of knowledge is as important as accumulation of capital to economic growth and development. He referred to how Europe leapfrogged China and India during the industrial revolution as economic growth was driven by inventions and innovations. He concluded by discussing some of the emerging areas of 'Econometric Research', like, 'Experimental Economics' and 'Happiness Studies'.

Seventy two participants from across the country and abroad presented the papers during the two-day conference. Out of which 7 papers were presented by faculty members and research scholars from IBS Hyderabad. Session chairs and presenters of technical papers include researchers from International Food Policy Research Institute, New Delhi; Jawaharlal Nehru University, New Delhi; Gokhale Institute of Politics and Economics, Pune; Birla Institute of Technology and Science, Pilani; Indian Institutes of Technology at Kanpur, Kharagpur and Hyderabad; Central Universities of Pondicherry, Tamil Nadu and Hyderabad; Jamia Millia Islamia, New Delhi; University of Mumbai; Institute of Public Enterprises, Hyderabad and many others.

Several eminent persons visited the Department during the academic year. They included Prof. Suresh Sundaresan, the Chase Manhattan Bank Foundation Professor of Financial Institutions at the Finance and Economics Division of the Columbia Business School; Dr. Amlan Mitra, Professor of Economics at Purdue University Calumet, Hammond, Indiana; Prof. Navjyoti Singh, Professor & Head, Centre for Exact Humanities, IIIT Hyderabad; Mr Satish Khanna, Founder & Moderator, LAZORR and former President, Lupin Pharmaceuticals; Dr Ulrike Reinhad, author and founder of DNAdigital, Germany; Dr Reena Ramachandran, Member, Ad Hoc Task Force, Department of Performance Management, Cabinet Secretariat, Govt. of India and Strategic Advisor for Innovation University Project, New Delhi; Mr Poonacha T. G., Assistant Director of Pre-University Education, Karnataka, Dr Sreekanth Venkataraman, Vice-President (Business Incubation and Acceleration) at the University of Petroleum and Energy Studies, Dehradun; and Mr Pradeep Goswami, DGM, Andhra Bank.

8.1.2 Finance and Accounting

The Department of Finance has thirty faculty members and eight research scholars. Twenty faculty members have a PhD degree and the rest are pursuing their PhD. The Department also has faculty members with professional gualifications like CA and ICWA and industry experience. Four PhD scholars have defended their thesis and absorbed as Assistant professors, two research scholars submitted their PhD thesis and four research scholars have defended their proposals.

The Department offers various courses to meet the needs of the industry and recruiters in the contemporary areas of finance, banking, and accounting. Apart from the core courses in the area of Finance and Accounting, the Department also offers courses like financial modeling, financial econometrics, commodities and commodity derivatives, financial risk management and risk management in banks and equips the students with the skill sets required by the industry. Besides the MBA and PhD Programs, the faculty members also handle courses in BBA and BBA-LLB (Hons.). During the year the department conducted Management Development Programs in the area of Banking.

Department organized 10th The International Conference on Business and Finance - ICBF 2014, on January 9-10, 2014 in collaboration with Oklahoma State University, Finance Department. Prof. I M Pandey was the Chief Guest, and Prof. David Reeb, National University of Singapore was the Key Note Speaker. Prof. Lorne Switzer, Concordia University, Canada, Madhu Veeraraghavan, Monash University, Prof. Australia, Prof. Rajendra P. Srivastava, University of Kansas attended the conference. Two hundred and eight abstracts were received, out of which eighty-one papers (19 international and 62 national) were selected. Of the selected 81 papers 36 papers are presented in the conference. Selected papers from the proceedings were sent for review for publishing in three international journals - Managerial finance, American Journal of Business and International Journal of Emerging Markets. The Department publishes 'The IUP Journal of Accounting Research and Audit Practice' a double blind reviewed, Cabell's Indexed, and quarterly published Journal. The Department has a good number of international publications to its credit. During the year, 36 research papers were published by the faculty members in National and International reputed Journals. 10 of them are published in Scopus listed Journals. Faculty members of the Department also presented 5 apers at International Conferences and 11 papers at National conferences. During the year, 53 faculty seminars were conducted by the Department.

The research in the Department can be categorized in the area such as - Corporate Governance Practices in Banking Sector, Money Markets, Futures Market, Mutual Fund Industry Analysis, CRM in Banking Industry, Working Capital analysis in Manufacturing sector, Liquidity Management in Banks, Wealth Management Practices by Banks, Forecasting Electricity Prices in Deregulated Wholesale Spot Electricity Market, Underpricing, Long-Run Performance and Secondary-Market Liquidity, Institutional Investors and Stock Liquidity and Risk Premiums in the Indian Currency Futures Market

8.1.3 Human Resources and Soft Skills

The Department of Human Resources and Soft Skills

has 18 full time faculty members and 6 Adjunct faculty members. The department has 11 research scholars. Out of 11 research scholars, the thesis of three research scholars is at submission stage. Out of 18 full time faculty members, 7 have PhD qualification and 6 are pursuing PhD. Out of the 6 adjunct faculty members, four have PhD qualification.

The primary responsibility of the HR faculty is to groom the students on varied HR issues and to equip them to handle complex HR related problems and issues through the use of corporate examples, case studies, and research articles. Besides the MBA and PhD Programs, the faculty members also handle courses in BBA and BBA-LLB (Hons.).

During the year, the Department besides steering management core courses and ten electives, organized workshops. Fifty five students opted for specialization in the HR area. It conducted management development programs for corporate executives and also extended support to other departments in handling the MDPs organized by the institute. The faculty members were also invited by Corporate and Government organizations such as the National Institute of Rural Development (NIRD), Indian Railways, ASCI, and A.P. Productivity Council, COD, to deliver guest lectures for senior executives on specific themes in HR and OB areas. The faculty members were also engaged in Industry interaction, developing industry specific cases, and arranging guest lectures for the benefit of students.

The Department contributed 34 articles in journals and magazines. Five of them are published in Scopus listed Journals. During the year, 19 faculty seminars were conducted and the faculty members presented 23 papers at national and international conferences. The focus areas of research were Employer branding, Work Life Balance, Organizational Citizenship Behavior, Competency Mapping, Emotional Labor and Timeperspective.

The department organized an International Conference on April 11-12, 2013, wherein 46 papers were received, 28 of them were accepted and 22 papers were presented out of which 5 papers were presented by faculty members and research scholars of IBS Hyderabad. Delegates from three countries viz. Srilanka, Iran and Kazakisthan participated in the conference apart from delegates from various institutes and organizations from India.

The Soft Skills sessions focus on Experiential Learning. The primary responsibility of the Soft Skills faculty is to groom the students in Communication, Personality development, and Business communication related issues. They also provide insights using corporate examples so that the students can tackle business operations with aplomb and ease. The faculty members handle the Career Management and the Business communication courses. The students are also exposed to corporate etiquette including dining etiquette. During the year, the faculty members handled MDPs/workshops for executives of Corporates, and delivered guest lectures at national level institutions and public sector undertakings like the National Institute of Micro, Small & Medium Enterprises (NIMSME), National Academy of Construction (NAC), Nuclear Fuel Complex (NFC), ICRISAT, etc. The Soft Skills faculty members contributed case studies and book reviews and presented papers at conferences during the year. The Department also handles a Journal in the Soft Skills area. Besides, it produces a monthly in-house newsletter to disseminate information regarding the happenings at IFHE.

8.1.4 Marketing and Strategy

The Department has 25 full time faculty members. Sixteen hold doctorate degrees while two are in the final stages of their PhD from JNTU Hyderabad. The Department has 21 research scholars who are at different stages of their PhD work. They are working on a diverse range of marketing areas. Two scholars have submitted their final dissertation and are awaiting evaluation reports.

Twenty two Faculty members from the department have an average of 5 years of industry experience. This wealth of knowledge and wisdom allows faculty to share and connect to the students in a more realistic and meaningful way thus bridging the gap between theory and practice. Faculty members handle courses in the flagship MBA program, BBA, BBA - LLB(Hons.) and PhD.

The primary responsibility of the faculty members is to enable students gain varied marketing domain skills, knowledge, and abilities and to provide insights which are contemporary and have a bearing on creating and sustaining customer value.

Students at the MBA level are offered 12 elective courses in Marketing which help them gain the requisite domain knowledge to meet the demands of industry. This year, there is a proposal to introduce Rural Marketing as an elective course.

The Department has introduced several innovations in teaching pedagogy. The entire Strategic Marketing Management Course is run through a simulation game and helps students appreciate the nuances of this function. In Services Marketing course faculty members motivate students to create active service blue prints of different service organizations. In Customer Relationship Management a simulation game helps students understand customer lifetime value. In Integrated Marketing Communication course industry executives were invited for the annual "Showcase" where students present creative campaigns to prospective clients and advertising agencies. In the Sales & Distribution course, students actively participate in Role plays.

During the academic year 2013-14 faculty members and research scholars published 44 research papers and case studies in reputed journals of which 9 were published in international Journals. Nine papers were published in journals listed in Scopus/ ABDC. Faculty members presented about 20 papers at various National and International conferences. Of these, 8 papers were presented at conferences organized by IIM Lucknow, IIT Delhi, Great Lakes Institute of Management, Chennai, IMT Ghaziabad, XLRI, Jamshedpur etc. During the year faculty members and scholars presented nearly 29 seminars within the department. Faculty members from the area conducted one Faculty Development Program on Structural Equation Modeling – Basic Applications on Jan 9 - 10, 2014 at IBS campus.

The Department successfully organized the 5th International Conference on Marketing & Business Strategy (August 8-9, 2013) on the theme "Global Economic Crisis – Implications for Marketing & Strategy". A total of 90 papers were received. Post review, 52 papers were shortlisted of which 48 papers were presented. Planning is on for hosting a conference in the year 2015 and faculty members are in the process of identifying interesting topics in the domain of marketing with a quest for relevance and contemporariness.

In terms of industry student interaction the department invited three senior managers from industry. Mr. Ravi Menon, CEO, BigBasket.com, Asit Barma, Sr. Vice President, Value Labs and Mr. Sundar Subramaniam, Director, Product Management at Salesforce.com. They delivered lectures on Marketing analytics, Strategic Use of Big Data, Salesforce management etc. to students and faculty members. These lectures received very high appreciation from students and faculty members.

Core areas of research in the department can be grouped under Services Marketing, Consumer Behavior, Retailing, and Brand Management. Faculty members are striving to publish in Scopus listed journals as well as working on totally new areas such as social media marketing, online marketing, and social entrepreneurship. In terms of conferences, faculty members have received invitations to present papers at leading conferences being organized by IIM Ahmedabad (Jan 7-9, 2015) and IIM Indore (May 8 – 11, 2014) and AMS Annual Conference at Indianapolis, USA May 21-23, 2014.

The Department publishes The IUP Journal of Business Strategy, a double blind reviewed, Cabell's Indexed, and quarterly published Journal.

8.1.5 Operations and IT

The Department has a total strength of 27, out of which 15 hold a PhD degree and the remaining are pursuing their PhD. This strength of 27 is made up of eighteen faculty members and nine Research Scholars. The primary responsibility of the Department of Operations & Information Technology (IT) has been to make students proficient in the use of analytical and quantitative techniques and also in the use of IT tools for the purpose of problem solving for businesses.

The Department has two major disciplines, namely, Operations Management and Information Technology. The Operations Management discipline offers three core courses, namely, Operations Management and Quantitative Methods – 1 and Quantitative Methods – 2. In addition, the discipline offers elective courses in the area of Supply Chain Management, Project Management, Services Operations Management, etc. Currently, there are eight faculty members in this discipline, six of whom hold PhD degrees. There are nine research scholars pursuing their PhDs in the areas of Operations Management and Supply Chain Management. During the course of this year, three scholars completed their PhDs.

The IT discipline offers courses spread over four semesters in the two-year MBA program, two of them being core courses, namely, Information Systems for Managers and Business Process Integration (using SAP ERP software). The remaining elective courses offered are Business Intelligence and Business Analysis. The IT discipline has six experienced faculty members and all of them hold a PhD degree. There are three research scholars pursuing their PhDs in the area of Information Technology & Systems.

During this year, the faculty members of the Department published 17 research papers, out of which ten were published in international journals, and the remaining in Indian journals. Twenty Seven faculty seminars were organized. One research paper titled "Analysis of Agile testing attributes for faster time to Market: Context of Manufacturing sector related IT projects" presented in the Annual International Research Conference (organized by Symbiosis Institute of Management Studies, Pune) won the first Best Paper prize in the category of IT. Another research paper titled "The Mediating Role of Customer Related Performance Outcome on the Relationship between Customer Integration and Firm Performance: An Investigation in Indian Context" presented in the ISDSI 2013 conference (organized by IMI, Delhi) won the Second prize under Doctoral Track. The focus areas of research of the Department are Supply Chain Management, Operations Management, Electronic & Mobile Commerce, Information Systems and Enterprise Resource Planning.

Two workshops, one on Multi-Variate techniques and another on Structural Equation Modeling (SEM), were conducted during June and September respectively of 2013. The Department handles one journal, namely, The IUP Journal of Knowledge Management under the editorship of a faculty member.

The Department successfully organized second international conference on the theme, "Business Intelligence, Analytics and Knowledge Management (BIAKM-2012)," during 17-19 April, 2013 in collaboration with Hong Kong Polytechnic University (Poly U), Hong Kong. A pre-conference workshop on Business Analytics was organized on 17th April 2013. A total of 30 papers were presented and 60 delegates including academicians and professionals from industry from both India and Indonesia took part in deliberations across two days. The papers were classified into five important research areas – (i) Business Intelligence & Analytics, (ii) Knowledge Management, Data Mining & Data Warehousing, (iii) Information Systems & Best Practices, (iv) Technology & Computing and (v) Data Mining & Best Practices. The Department is planning to organize a similar kind of conference (BIAKM-2014) in August 13-14, 2014.

8.1.6 Case Research Center (CRC)

Case Research and Case Writing activities were initiated in the year 2000. The CRC has developed a total of 4700 cases till March 31, 2014, which includes 121 cases (7 primary cases), developed between April 2013 and March 2014. These cases have been developed in different areas of management viz., Strategy (31 cases); Marketing (15 cases); Finance (18 cases); Economics (8 cases); Human Resource Management/Organizational Behavior (10 cases); Information Technology/ Operations Research (9 cases); Business Ethics/Corporate Governance (14 cases); others (16 cases). All these cases are uploaded to the UK-based The Case Centre (formerly European case clearing house) website (www.thecasecentre.org) as well as to the CRC's sites (www.icmrindia.org and www. ibscdc.org). IBS Hyderabad is among the top five largest case contributors from across the globe to The Case Centre, the world's largest repository of case studies on business management.

The CRC is manned by a team of 17 members with many years of academic and corporate experience. The team works closely with the faculty members of various departments in developing the cases and mapping them to concepts and topics in standard textbooks. This provides a ready reference for B-School faculty members who can pick up cases that have already been mapped for classroom discussion. Over the years, the CRC has been developing contemporary and thought-provoking case studies that provide great learning value to the students.

In addition to the top ranked B-schools in India, the case studies developed by CRC are used by elite B-Schools and premier consulting firms such as Wharton School of Business, London Business School, the University of Oxford, INSEAD, McKinsey, Bain & Company, PriceWaterhouseCoopers, The Boston Consulting Group and Massachusetts Institute of Technology.

IBS CRC cases have regularly won awards at some of the most prestigious global case writing competitions such as the oikos Global Case Writing Competition, Dark Side Case Writing Competition, CEEMAN/ Emerald Case Writing Competition, EFMD Case Award, 4th AESE Case Writing Competition, The Case Centre Case Awards.

The winning cases have also regularly figured in the list of The Case Centre's best sellers since the year 2006. More than 126 case studies have been published in leading international textbooks and journals. The institution has demonstrated that its case study initiative is not only successful and economically viable but also a self sustaining activity. This initiative is one of the strengths of the University and the institution continues to build on this strength.

8.2 Faculty of Science and Technology

The IFHE, after getting the necessary approval from the University Grants Commission in May 2010, established the Faculty of Science and Technology (FST) to offer the 4-year B.Tech Program from the academic year 2010-11. FST is at present offering the B.Tech Program in the areas of Civil Engineering, Computer Science and Engineering, Electrical and Electronics Engineering, Electronics and Communication Engineering and Mechanical Engineering. There were 536 students in the B. Tech Program as on March 31, 2014.

The faculty comprises competent individuals in all areas of science and engineering with rich experience in academia and industry. At present, there are 40 full-time faculty members. The number of faculty members with PhD and M.Tech qualifications is 14 and 26 respectively. There are 12 faculty members, who have registered for their PhDs with different universities. Recruitment of additional faculty members, preferably with PhD qualifications, is in progress to meet future requirements in teaching and research.

During the academic year 2013-14, the Faculty of Science and Technology contributed 18 research papers in national and international journals out of which seven were listed with Scopus. The faculty members of FST presented twelve papers at conferences. The Department conducted 26 weekly faculty seminars on diverse topics.

Faculty members are engaged in research broadly in the areas of image processing, wireless communications, power systems and fuzzy logic, data and web mining techniques, network security, object oriented systems and adaptive algorithms, parallel processing and real time systems, ferrite composite materials, non linear dynamics, quantum computations, mathematical physics, semi conducting oxide glasses, organic synthesis of molecules of medicinal importance, coordination chemistry, semi rings, algebraic geometry, number theory, soil structure interaction, slope stability problems in civil engineering and robotics, etc.

8.3 Faculty of Law

The Faculty of Law offers the BBA-LLB (Hons.) Program, a 5-year Integrated Course approved by the Bar Council of India. Thirty five students were admitted to the First Year of the fourth batch

(i.e., 2013-18). The Faculty of Law aims to impart interdisciplinary knowledge through more than 60 different courses spread over ten semesters, gradually moving out to Law courses from Management Courses. Additionally, it also has five legal Internships running into four weeks each continuously as per the mandate of the Bar Council of India. The details of the program are available on www.ifheindia.org.

The Summer Legal Internship forms an important component of education in the Faculty of Law. It is an attempt to bridge the gap between the professional world and academic institutions and a vehicle for introducing the students to real-life situations. The students of BBA-LLB (Hons.) undertake the internship program at the end of each year during the summer holidays. They are sent to Law Firms, Advocate Offices, Offices of High Court and Supreme Court Judges, Corporate Offices, NGOs, Consumer Forums, and Human Right Commissions. During their internship, the students are encouraged to take up assignments which are multidisciplinary, goaloriented, and time-bound and involve team work. The internship helps the students to apply the concepts learnt in the classrooms to real-life situations. The Law program provides integrated learning of management and law and theoretical learning and application. The students are trained in moot courts and mock trials on a continuous basis to improve their analytical reasoning, legal aptitude, advocacy skills, and to understand the relationship between the bar and the bench. This apart, regular guest lectures and interfaces with eminent persons from the judiciary, members of the legal fraternity, academicians and other public authorities are organized for the students.

The Faculty of Law has Nine faculty members including the Dean. The faculty members possess excellent academic credentials in the areas of Constitutional Law, Labor Law, Mercantile Law, Criminal Law, etc. The Department also utilizes the services of adjunct faculty from IBS and Visiting Faculty. Out of the nine faculty members, four are with PhD Degrees and the rest are pursuing their PhD at other universities. The faculty members have published good number of research papers in reputed journals and presented quite a good number of papers at national and international seminars and conferences. The Faculty of Law organized a One-Day Seminar on "Financial Sector Legislative Reforms in India" in collaboration with Department of Finance, Faculty of Management, IFHE on August 20th, 2013. Every faculty member presents monthly faculty seminars on contemporary legal topics on rotation Basis. During this period nine seminars were presented by the Faculty.

The areas of research include Constitutional Law, Labor Law, Criminal Law, Environmental Law, Corporate Law, Cyber Law, Intellectual Property Rights and Alternate Dispute Resolution Mechanisms.

9. Faculty Resources and Support Staff

The University has a pool of faculty with excellent academic credentials and industry experience. Some of the faculty members have PhDs from foreign universities; some have qualified from IIMs/IITs. The current full time faculty strength of the university is 206. The details of faculty strength and their profiles are as follows:


14. Workshops

15. Center for Management Development

IBS CMD is primarily involved in offering training for executives from industry and academia from various institutes and universities on contemporary topics in different areas. 16. Editorship in Journals

The faculty members of the University are associated with the following nine in-house journals as consulting editors. The manuscripts received by the journals are double blind refereed. The average review time is three to six months. The acceptance rate of these journals varies from 20% to 50%. All these journals are listed in the Cabell directory and SSRN (Social Science Research Network). In addition, the IUP Journal of Applied Economics is listed in SOSIG (Social Science Information Gateway) and RePEc (Research Papers in Economics). The IUP Journal of Accounting Research and Audit Practice is listed in RePEc. The journals attract articles from abroad (about 25%), from different parts of the country (about 68%), and from internal faculty (about 7%). Some of the faculty members are also associated as scientific advisors.

17. Academic and Industry Collaborations

The University has a strong interface with industry through collaborations, guest lectures, and executive development programs. Overall, it interfaces with more than 600 of the country's leading companies, NGOs, and law firms. An industry-institute interface has resulted in the structuring of a customized elective course 'International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRS) based Financial Statement Analysis' for one of the world's largest ITeS companies. IFHE has entered into collaboration with 16 international universities and eight national institutes - IGIDR, BSE India, Indian Econometric Society, C-TARA (Indian Railways), Intelligroup, National Commission for Protection of Child Rights, Virtusa and Indian Institute of Capital Market. These collaborations have resulted in the joint hosting of conferences, summer internship programs, visiting Scholar Programs with the collaborating universities and conducting MDPs for partnering organizations.

An MoU with Virtusa, a global business consulting and IT outsourcing company was signed on July 17, 2013, with an objective of creating a poll of skilled Business process Management Professionals. It was signed by Mr Keith Modder, COO Virtusa and Dr J.Mahender Reddy, Vice-Chancellor, IFHE.

As per the MoU, Virtusa, trains the the faculty members and students of FST on Pegasystems Technology Platform. Students on completing the program will be eligible for internships at Virtusa. Virtusa will also support the faculty in developing industry-oriented courseware. Faculty of Science and Technology became an organizational member of 'Institution of Electronics and Telecommunication Engineers (IETE)' New Delhi.

17.1 Foreign Collaborations

To promote academic and research collaboration, IFHE has partnered with several universities abroad. These collaborations presently form the base for the Visiting Scholar Program for Research Scholars. These programs are aimed at inculcating global management research skills in the students and improving their ability to engage in critical thinking and communicate effectively across cultures. The University continues to have collaborations with the following universities:

17.2 Academic Collaborations with Industry

The Business School grooms students for the corporate world and aims at making the business study relevant. Industry interaction happens at various levels. Industry experts are invited to be members of the Board of Studies. IBS has a reputation for innovative program design and delivery, quality courseware, personalized instruction, strong industry interface, research, consultancy and publications. Taking cognizance of the market requirements and in tune with larger societal requirements, many new electives have been introduced. To cite a few , Corporate Communication in the domain of HR & Soft skills and Rural Marketing in the domain of Marketing. Introduction to Public Policy was introduced as a core subject.



18. Alumni and Student Activities

The University is at a nascent stage as only six batches have passed out from IBS Hyderabad. As a beginning, the University is involving the alumni in various activities relating to the admission process and curriculum development, inviting them for guest lectures, and involving them in mock interviews and various other activities. To begin with, IBS Hyderabad started the Alumni Relations Cell (ARC). The purpose is to enrich the lives of the alumni by helping them to establish lifetime relationships with their fellow alumni. The ARC is guided/ mentored by senior member of Corporate Relations department of the University. The cell invites alumni for regular visits and conducts various extracurricular activities and get-together functions, which help them to add value to their professional well-being and to the University. This involves encouraging meaningful involvement and leadership from all the alumni for the benefit of the community as a whole. Such involvement also offers value driven services targeted at providing ample entertainment, learning, and educational and networking opportunities to the alumni community.

Students graduating from IBS Hyderabad become part of IBS Alumni Federation (IBSAF), which has chapters in several cities across the country and abroad. IBSAF chapters organize several events for the benefit of the alumni. IFHE recognizes that involving the alumni in the activities of the institute can greatly benefit the University.

Currently, the University involves its alumni in various activities. Members of the alumni body are, as stated earlier, part of the admission process. They also contribute to the curriculum development process, deliver guest lectures, mentor students, conduct mock interviews and assist in the placement process.

We understand the importance of getting online in this virtual world and the role it plays in achieving our mission. As a part of our endeavor in this direction, we have expanded our online presence in almost all of the events we have undertaken and in this regard, we have also dedicated full-time websites to our flagship events namely NOSTALGIA and ALUMNI MENTORSHIP PROGRAM. Also, we have strengthened our presence on social media networks with dedicated pages and links in an effort to better connect with people. This year we have achieved yet another milestone by introducing an all exclusive blog for our alumni which would feature selected articles from them and provides them more ways to stay connected. Our online presence now include: Dedicated Webpage, Facebook, Twitter, Blog & Youtube.

Selection Process of Class of 2016:

Twenty-two alumni were a part of the selection process for the Class of 2016 held from Feb18 to 26, 2014. They also participated in selection briefings held at Hotel Taj Vivanta on February 2 and 3, 2014.

SIP and Best Teacher Awards 2013:

Further, IBSAF annually recognizes the services of one teacher whose contributions to teaching have been immense. Interestingly, the selection for this award is done on the basis of the feedback given by the current students. Similarly, IBSAF through sponsored special awards recognizes excellence in the summer internship pursued by the students. Thus, alumni members play a very constructive role by not only taking part in the key events of the University's academic calendar, but also by recognizing and motivating other key stakeholders. SIP Event was organized on 25th August 2013. Nineteen alumni participated to evaluate and select the best SIP Projects out of about 45 presentations made by students.

Annual Alumni Meet:

The ARC of IBS Hyderabad, with the support of the Hyderabad chapter of IBSAF, organized NOSTALGIA 3.0, 2013 – the Alumni Meet of the IBS on November 30, 2013. The event was attended by more than 400 alumni from across the country and their family members starting from Class of 1997 to 2013.

Most members of the alumni federation are keen to give back to their alma mater. Their interest and commitment to the institution is tapped by the ARC, which invites them for guest lectures and mentoring sessions. Often, alumni also take a keen interest in the development and activities of the student clubs on campus, which they were a part of when they were students themselves. Thus, the various student-run clubs, committees, and cells also facilitate alumni interaction with current students and faculty members.

Mentorship Program:

We launched a mentorship program on November 30, 2013. In this program alumni were invited to share their wisdom and corporate experiences with the current batch and hone their skills to make them corporate ready. The idea is to enhance the skills and get students mentored by our own alumni on topics such as:

- Academic Guidance (course selection, study skills, post-undergraduate school planning)
- Career Advice (résumé critiques, interviewing tips, general career guidance)
- Personal Development (networking, hobbies, recreation, cultural/ethnic sensitivity)

In all 170 alumni applied for the Mentorship Program. Out of these 24 mentors came on the day of Nostalgia 3.0 to mentor the students. The remaining mentors will take part in the program off-site. Over 200 students benefitted from this program.

Connections Magazine:

Alumni Relations Cell launched the 5th edition of Connections Magazine in September 2013.

The magazine reached another milestone this year with the introduction of a brand new reading interface to enhance reading pleasure. The new design encompasses a book layout with a user interactive interface. The 6th edition of the magazine was made interactive and could be viewed online. The magazine consists of articles from alumni on their experiences of the corporate world or lessons from life that they would like to share with the current students and fellow alumni.

18.1 Faculty of Management

Student activities continued to see wholehearted involvement of students and encouragement from the management and faculty members this year too. They remain at the core of the philosophy of management education, IBS Hyderabad believes in. Co-curricular and extra-curricular activities are very much a part of the day to day life at IFHE campus. In spite of their hectic academic schedule, students of the Faculty of Management (IBS Hyderabad) are very active outside the classrooms too. Highly self-motivated and capable students run several student bodies - Clubs, Cells, and Committees - that organize and manage these cocurricular and extracurricular activities round the year on the campus. Events across all areas of management as well as those related to sports, socio-cultural events, and the arts are organized by these bodies throughout the year.

At IBS Hyderabad, there are clubs or cells in almost every functional area of management. Students with a focus on marketing and strategy have at least two clubs that may interest them: While ADmire is a club for students interested in advertising and branding, Maverick is more focused on selling and strategizing. Students who are interested in the Finance domain also have a choice of clubs to be part of: Money Matters is a club with its focus on money and banking, while FinStreet is a club focused on the financial markets. VriddhiResearch, a division of FinStreet, is a completely student-run cell whose focus is entirely on learning stock market operations and trading. EcoBizz is a club which focuses on public policy, the economy, and the business environment. Students who are interested in HR have a club called Convergence, while Kaizen is a club which caters to the interests of the students in the Operations area. The DOT club organizes events and activities related to technology in general and IT in particular.

There are several clubs whose activities go beyond the functional areas of business. Speak-Up is a club that organizes debates and public speaking competitions. Aiina is a club which encourages students to reflect on issues while using their talents in creative writing and art. Grey Matters is the official Quiz club of IBS Hyderabad. Members of Grey Matters compete and participate in general and business quiz competitions inside and outside the campus. Xpressionz is the name of the official theater society of IBS Hyderabad. Members of Xpressionz have enacted plays and have won theater competitions outside the campus as well. Nazaria is the popular photography club of the institution.

Infinity Studios is a student club with a focus on movie appreciation and making. It not only presents critically acclaimed movies on a weekly basis but also conducts film festivals and other programs which are based on movie themes. This year, Infinity Studios, went beyond their mandate and held a day-long event on campus to make the lives of special children from PAWMENCAP School better. The event, which was called Farishtey, was supported by Team Aiina, other students and IBS administration as well. Samavesh, the official cultural club of IBS Hyderabad, is one of the most active student bodies. It takes the lead in celebrating all festivals and national days and it truly celebrates the multi-cultural spirit of the campus. Samavesh indeed plays a big role in making students from all parts of the country feel at home. It has a tie-up with SPIC-MACAY, the Society for Promotion of Indian Classical Music and Culture among Youth. The students also have a popular rock-band, Diatribe.

There are three clubs in the arena of adventure and sports, viz, VAPS, which is dedicated to the promotion of all sports and games, IBS Blues, which focuses on swimming and water sports, and Prakriti, which organizes nature-based events like trekking, bird watching, rock climbing, and rappelling. The VAPS team organizes several sports events round the year. It also organizes the Mrinal Anand Trophy Cricket tournament, an intra-IBS cricket tournament involving student, staff, and alumni teams.


The Prayaas Club plays the interesting role of coordinating the participation of IBS Hyderabad students in various external events and fests across the country. Newswire focuses on the news media and plays the dual role of keeping the campus informed about important events outside, especially in the field of business and finance, as well as of keeping the outside world informed of the happenings in IBS Hyderabad. Stu-z is the student-run intranet service, which is also used to stream audio (Campus Vani) and video to the entire campus.

IBS Hyderabad students, both post-graduate and undergraduate, have also been active in the field of charity and social action. Blood-donation camps, free dental check-ups, and other such activities have been organized in the last one year. Many students are active members of the Aashayein Foundation, which works among impoverished children. Several clubs support the work of Aashayein Foundation. Sankalp is a club that promotes social and business leadership and works toward nation building. Sankalp is known for its flagship event, Megistanos, the Best Manager competition, which it organizes during the institution's annual inter B-school fest.

In addition to these clubs, there are two cells which are run by the students, viz, the Alumni Relations Cell, discussed in the previous section, and Maçon, the entrepreneurship cell of IBS Hyderabad. Among the many activities Maçon undertakes, the most important is the Incube program, which aims at encouraging, mentoring, and handholding students with basic business ideas in order to help them develop business plans which can attract funding and market support. Last year was the fourth year of the Incube program. The Centre for Entrepreneurship Development of the University and Maçon jointly celebrated the second week of November, 2013 as entrepreneurship week on campus. Many dignitaries including a Global Venture Capitalist visited the campus as there were seven invited lectures, four competitions, two workshops and one start-up showcase during the week. While earlier Maçon was part of the National Entrepreneurship Network, now Maçon itself has emerged as a network of entrepreneurship cell with units in institutes like IBS Pune and NIT Trichy.

The Student Activities Department, with the support of all the clubs, cells, and committees, organizes five major events during the year. At the beginning of the academic year, the new batch of students is formally welcomed by the senior batch through a festive program christened 'Freshers'. Similarly, toward the end of the year, the students organize a farewell for the outgoing batch. The national sports meet for Business Schools in India, Aaveg, is organized in the second week of December. The biggest event of the year though, is the national inter-business school management and cultural festival, Trishna, which is organized every year in the third week of January.

Trishna 2014 saw participation from over 15 premier business schools from across the country. As in the previous year, the Department of Management of Christ College, Bangalore, was the overall winner this year. In 2012, there was a CSR partner for the first time. That practice continued in 2013 and in 2014 too. The CSR partner for Trishna 2014 was the Indian Development Foundation, a nationally well-known NGO working in the field of health, education and development, which has a special Consultative Status with the UN Economic and Social Council. That the students here consider it important to associate a social cause with their



Aaveg 4.0, the sports meet, was successfully held from December 13 to 15, 2013. Teams from over twelve business schools across the country competed for glory in ten different events viz, Badminton, Basket Ball, Counter Strike, Football, Squash, Swimming, Table Tennis, Tennis, Throwball, and Volleyball.

This year, the undergraduate students of IFHE Hyderabad, for the first time, organized a inter-university undergraduate fest, Triti 2014, in February 2014. The BBA students of IBS Hyderabad organized management competitions as well as cultural events as part of Triti 2014, which saw participation from several city colleges. A number of events including Aarambh 2013, an intracollegiate literary and cultural fest, Cricket and Basketball tournaments; and Cultural programs were organized by the BBA students during the year.

18.2 Faculty of Science & Technology

Several cultural and curricular activities were celebrated during the period. A few prominent ones are presented below:

IckNighted 2013, a techno-cultural festival was celebrated on April 10, 2013 with full zeal and enthusiasm. The festival included technical events like technical quiz, codestream, paper presentation and circucuit master and the cultural events included Danceunited, Ick-nighted Idol, On that Point—Debate, Director's cut, Jam, Dumb charades, Entertainment Quiz, Online gaming, Rock Band, and DJ nite. It was an excellent opportunity for the students to showcase their technical and cultural talents. A 30 days soft skills workshop @ FST



was conducted for the students of 3rd Year from May 28 to June 27, 2013. Two Faculty members Ms. Gitanjali and Dr. Bhavana Jaiswal from IBS Hyderabad, trained the students in various topics like Self Awareness, Perception, Effective Presentation Skills, Group Discussion and Interview Techniques.

Engineer's day - The 12th and 13th of September was celebrated as Engineers' day with great enthusiasm. The inaugural function was graced by Dr.T.Hanuman Chowdhary, the astounding personality who has played an instrumental role in the development of the Department of Telecommunications and bringing the present day information technology to India.

Electronica Club - On 29th September 2013 the Electronic Club of the Faculty of Science and Technology, was inaugurated with great fervour and enthusiasm. The Guest of Honour, Shri Y.S. Sundar Reddy presented his experiences and anecdotes as a Senior Project Manager of the reputed HELA Systems Ltd. TRITI', the Techno Cultural & Management Fest Was held between12-Feb and 15 Feb-2014. The first two days were allotted to the Management and Law students for their events and next two days events were hosted mainly by FST.

ARTHROBOTICS - a two-day workshop on robotics was organized on 8th & 9th March 2014, by the Mechanical Engineering Dept of FST.in association with Technophilia Systems, Indo - US Robo League and IIT Bombay. The program provided specialized training to the students in building robots for the applications like Line follower/ Obstacle Avoidance/ Path memorizing, Wall Follower etc. The participants of the program were given an internationally recognized certificate, free kit (for a batch of 5 students) and an opportunity to represent in National Round of Robotics Championship India at IIT Bombay .Those qualified there will represent India in Indo- S Robo League and RoboGames, USA.

Women's Day Celebration - Women's Day Celebration - As part of the extended celebrations of Women's Day at IFHE, an interactive session was organized 19th March 2014. Dr. Elizabeth Zacharias, member, Women's cell, FST, Mr. Muralidhar Menon (Regional Director, Principal Retirement Advisors, A.P) and Deepa Nittala (a veteran banker and leading Financial Planner) addressed the gathering.

18.3 Faculty of Law

A Demo and Presentation on Manupatra was conducted on August 09, 2013. A debate on 'Formation of Smaller States' was organized on August 10, 2013. The faculty of law intranet was inagugrated on August 10, 2013. A 10 K Independence Day Run was organized on August 14, 2013. The maiden issue of 'The Student', an online magazine was launched on Novemebr 4, 2013. Yes+ (Youth Empowerment & Skills) a workshop on AoL was conducted by Mr. Rohit Agarwal, Faculty, Art of Living, on January 3, 2014. 'Knight Rangers' (Sports Club, Faculty of Law) organized an Internal Tournament among all the batches of Faculty of Law from January 6 to January 10, 2014. Internal Moot Court competition was conducted on March 3, 2014. International Women's Day, was celebrated on March 7, 2014.



19. Placements

Placements have been satisfactory for the batch of 2014, with 992 students graduating from the MBA program during the year. Out of the total number of students who participated in the placement process, 798 had been placed in 168 organizations. One hundred and twenty seven students have opted out of placements to join or start their own businesses or have found a job of their interest.

In his key-note address at the 3rd Convocation of ICFAI Foundation for Higher Education (IFHE). Maira said humanity needs better institutions not only for economic growth but also for justice in the society.


"Trust of Indians on institutions is declining and it is the responsibility of all the caretakers of the society to reconcile their roles to eliminate the trust deficit. Institutions of democracy, capitalism, and government must be reformed and rebuilt to suit the changing times," Maira said.

"The challenge before us as we march into the 21st century is to make capitalism and economics our tools, rather than human beings becoming their tools. Therefore let us first determine our aspirations and principles, and accordingly devise the form of capitalism and economics we want," he said.

Hyderobad, April 7 There is a need for reforming institutions to foster economic growth and social harmony, according to Arun Maira, Member, Planning Member, Commission.

In his convocation address the Icfai Foundation for Higher Education (IFHE) here on Friday, Maira said institutions in the country were facing a crisis of trust-deficit.

"Countries with very similar resource endowments have different economic growth trajectories because they have different institutional capabil-ities," he said.

Lecture on TIPS

The ICFAI University, Hyderabad, organised a lecture on The Treasury Inflation Protected Securities' by Suresh Sundaresan, Chase Manhattan Bank Professor of Economics and Finance, Columbia University, New York. Speaking on the impor-tance of Treasury Inflation Protected Securities (TIPS), Dr. Sundaresan opined that government securities can serve as public goods. High-lighting the role of inflationlinked government backed securities or TIPS in protecting long term economic interests of a country, he said they not only provide a pricediscovery function for the risk-free cost of borrowing at different maturities, but more importantly, they have a policing role in imposing monetary and fiscal disci-pline. In another session, speaking on Global Financial Crisis Policy Interventions, Dr. Sundaresan identified three structural factors for the crisis. The first was global imbalances in savings that led to the large scale import of capital by the United States from countries like China and Germany. The second, he identified as demographics that are working to the disadvantage of most developed countries, wherein a minority of young population are

IBS Hyderabad sold 21,000 copies of its cases worldwide between October and December 2013. This is the largest number of cases it has sold in a quarter. Over 100 institutions across the world, including London School of Economics, London School of Business, Manchester Business School and IMD, as well as organisations such as KPMG and McKinsey, are among the major buyers.

The Case Research Centre at IBS Hyderabad generates at least 150 new cases a year. It is now one of the largest repositories for indigenously developed management case studies in India.

Dedicated efforts over the years to build a storehouse of case research means that besides preparing students for the world outside the classroom, the sale of these cases ensures a steady revenue for the institution.

"We were one of the first to successfully and consistently use the case-study approach significantly, over and above textbooks. We believe this comprehensively prepares students for the real world," said Dr J. Mahender Reddy, Vice-Chancellor, ICFAI Foundation for Higher Education (IFHE).

Largest Source

Prof G. V. Muralidhara, Dean of the Case Research Centre at IBS Hyderabad, adds: "We're the single largest source for Indian topics with respect to management case studies and we develop cases on international and trending topics too. Our cases are contemporary. All our students go through 400-500 cases, because it's impossible for them to visit all the companies out there.

"To date, we have about 5,500 cases on management and all functional aspects of management, like HR and Finance. We also engage in research in areas of societal impact."

Relevant Studies

IBS Hyderabad's case studies take matters of global as well as local relevance into consideration when exploring brands such as Starbucks and Ikea. They also delve into topics of interest in the Indian context, such as Air Asia and Etihad's foray into the aviation sector or leadership issues surrounding the retirement of Ratan Tata. Many of the Institute's cases get reprinted in several textbooks worldwide. IBS Hyderabad's cases have won more than 35 awards in international competitions. Dr Reddy said: "We spent #20 crore just on research over the last three years, because churning out new cases is an important agenda for us."

Muralidhara adds: "About 60 per cent of our income comes from cases sold to international buyers and this has now become a self-sustaining activity. But, along with making us money, it gives us brand value and is very useful for us internally."

Antibacterial and antifungal activity of the title compounds (Illa-IIIe) was compared with standards namely Furacin and Flucanazole. All the synthesized arylazo imidazoles have shown significant activity against the tested microbes. The compounds IIIb, IIIc and IIId exhibit relatively higher activity than the standards.
