The department is a part of IBS Hyderabad (which is constituent of Faculty of Management of the University)

4. Names of programmes offered (UG, PG, M.Phil., Ph.D., Integrated Masters; Integrated Ph.D., D.Sc., D.Litt., etc.):

The Economics Department offers foundation and advanced courses to BBA, BBA-LLB (Hons.), MBA, PhD in Management (Full-Time and Part-Time) and Executive MBA (Part-Time) (from academic year 2015-16) in the faculty of management. These include Managerial Macro **Economics** and Economics. **Business** Environment. International Finance Trade. Financial and Econometrics, Entrepreneurship and Development.

It also plans to offer PhD Program in Economics from academic year 2015-16.

5. Interdisciplinary programmes and departments involved:

Since MBA Program is interdisciplinary, the Economics department is engaged to handle courses in PhD, MBA Program as well as in BBA and BBA-LLB (Hons.). The Economics faculty members also teach courses offered by Finance and Accounting and Marketing and Strategy Departments.

6. Courses in collaboration with other universities, industries, foreign institutions, etc.

Two faculty members from the department had an opportunity to teach Macro Economics and Business Environment to the students of MBA second semester abroad at University of South Australia, Adelaide, Australia during October 2010 – January 2011.

7. Details of programmes discontinued, if any, with reasons:

Executive MBA Program (One year duration) was discontinued in 2011. The primary reason being the salary packages for students with 3-4 years of experience could not match their expectations.

However, we are introducing an Executive MBA (Part-Time) Program (21 Months duration) from July 2015.

8. Examination System: Annual/Semester/Trimester/Choice Based Credit System:

Semester.

IBS Hyderabad has been a pioneer in adopting the semester system since its inception in 1995. It adopts Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) system and has a cafeteria approach in selection of courses. Wide choices of electives are offered, and students choose based on their preferences.

46. How does the department ensure that programme objectives are constantly met and learning outcomes are monitored?

Courses and curriculum are periodically assessed for relevance. Case studies are changed and fresh ones introduced keeping the changing needs of the market place in mind. Teaching groups are formed in each course who meet at regular intervals to discuss the case studies and the theoretical inputs to be imparted in the respective sessions. Besides these initiatives.

- Continuous evaluation is done through class participation, periodic tests, quiz etc. The marks/grades are immediately communicated after evaluation to the students to improve their performance.
- All faculty members are members of various teaching groups (A teaching group consists of all faculty members teaching the same course in different sections). These groups meet weekly once to discuss the learning objectives of each chapter, the cases and prepare the discussion plan. In addition to cases, other pedagogical innovations are also discussed to meet the program objectives.
- As part of Mentorship Program, the faculty members counsel the students who fail to secure requisite marks/grades.

- 47. Highlight the participation of students and faculty in extension activities.
 - Faculty members are involved in organising guest lectures, seminars, conclaves etc to provide the students the industry experience and to interact with top business professionals. For instance, a Banking Conclave was organized on Sep 22, 2012 by Ecobiz club, mentored by a faculty member from the department which provided a platform to professionals from the Indian Banking industry, faculty members, and students to interact among themselves and to discuss various contemporary issues faced by the Indian Banking Industry. The program was sponsored by Syndicate Bank and Rural Electrification Corporation (REC). The themes of the conclave included Basel III implementation in Indian Banks, Financial inclusion initiatives, HRM practices and recruitment in PSU banks, recent trends in Corporate Finance, and IT implementation in Indian Banks. The speakers were Mr N.K Padhi, Retd GM, SBI; Dr M V N Reddy, AGM, Andhra Bank; Mr Maram Srikanth, AGM, IDBI Bank; Mr K Satyanarayana, CM, Syndicate Bank, and Mr C Sudhakar, Retd. AGM. Andhra Bank.
 - Another major event organised by the students and faculty is the entrepreneuship week. 'Entrepreneurship India 2014' was organized by Maçon, the student entrepreneurship cell in partnership with the Centre for Entrepreneurship Development of the University. The Centre is co-ordinated by a faculty member from the economics department. There were several lectures from special invitees including one on 'Finance for Value Creation' by Prasanna Chandra, the Director for Centre for Financial Management. At the end of the Entrepreneurship week, the valedictory address was delivered by Shri Abhaey Singh, the Chairman of Kauzala Group and the President of the Indian Debating Union. Shri Singh spoke on value-based leadership and its relevance for Indian entrepreneurs. According to him, Indian entrepreneurs have an edge when it comes to building sustainable business as most of them are rooted in the well-balanced Indian ethos. He advised the aspiring entrepreneurs of the University that they should never lose sight of their vision for something larger than their personal dreams and wishes, if they want to make a difference from a long-run perspective.

- 'Entrepreneurship India 2012' which was held on Dec 2012 saw lectures, workshops, start-up showcases, panel discussions and competitions. "Budding entrepreneurs should think beyond their region, community and even country and look at solving the world's problems" was what Dr Farooq Abdullah, the Honorable Minister for New and Renewable Energy, told in his address as the Chief Guest during the valedictory session of the entrepreneurship week. Dr Abdullah also talked about the success of the Jawaharlal Nehru National Solar Mission, the phase I of which is nearing completion and also the progress the country has made in wind energy in the last few years. Renewable energy sector offers business opportunities and the Ministry of New and Renewable Energy sector is developing energy solutions to firms and households, which have the potential to create several entrepreneurship opportunities. Mr. Murali Bukkapatnam, the President of TiE-Hyderabad, was the guest of honor during the occasion. - Continuous evaluation is done through class participation, periodic tests, quiz etc. The marks/grades are immediately communicated after evaluation to the students to improve their performance.
- All faculty members are members of teaching groups (A teaching group consists of all faculty members teaching the same course in different sections). These groups meet weekly once to discuss the learning objectives of each chapter, the cases and prepare the discussion plan. In addition to cases, other pedagogical innovations are also discussed to meet the program objectives.
- As part of Mentorship Program, the faculty members counsel the students who do not score the expected marks/grades.

- 46. How does the department ensure that programme objectives are constantly met and learning outcomes are monitored?

Courses and curriculum are periodically assessed for relevance. Case studies are changed and fresh ones are introduced keeping in mind the contemporariness. Teaching groups are formed in each course who meet at regular intervals to discuss the case studies and the theoretical inputs to be imparted in the respective sessions. Besides these initiatives,

- Continuous evaluation is done through class participation, periodic tests, quiz etc. The marks/grades are immediately communicated after evaluation to the students to improve their performance.
- All faculty members are members of teaching groups (A teaching group consists of all faculty members teaching the same course in different sections). These groups meet weekly once to discuss the learning objectives of each chapter, the cases and prepare the discussion plan. In addition to cases, other pedagogical innovations are also discussed to meet the program objectives.
- As part of Mentorship Program, the faculty members counsel the students who do not score the expected marks/grades.

The Department provides skill-based education to make the students acquire core skills necessary for employment and entrepreneurship. Several skill development courses namely Soft Skills, Business Communications, Etiquettes, and Personality Development have been introduced to make the students ready for the industry. The department also organized a lecture on Bharatanatyam where the importance of body language in communication was addressed.

Students are encouraged to participate in club activities. The summer internship program is quite exhaustive and provides learning opportunities. Students have done several important projects with various companies as interns. They are encouraged to work with industry in order to learn the business process through industry sponsored projects. They have worked with companies like ITC Signode, NTPC, L&T and TATA Motors.

The department of Marketing offers foundation and elective courses in the area of Marketing and Strategy for the MBA Program. For the BBA, BBA-LLB (Hons.) and B.Tech. programs the department offers faculty support to teach different courses (see sl No. 9 for details)

In the flagship MBA program 4 core courses and 16 electives courses are offered by the department. In the BBA program faculty teach six different courses, while in BBA-LLB (Hons.) two courses and for the B Tech program one course is handled by faculty from the department.

For the PhD program in Management, the department has designed one core course (Advanced Strategic Management) and five doctoral seminar courses spanning disciplines such as Essentials of Marketing, Consumer Research, Brand Management, Strategic Marketing and Services Marketing. Faculty from the department teach these courses.

Inputs to courses such as Quantitative Methods run by the Operations and IT department are derived after discussions with the department.

Executive MBA Program (One year duration) was discontinued in 2011. The primary reason being the salary packages for students with 3-4 years of experience could not match their expectations.

IBS Hyderabad has been a pioneer in adopting the semester system since its inception in 1995. It adopts Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) system. IBS Hyderabad has a cafeteria approach in selecting elective courses. Wide choices of electives are offered. For example the MBA students select 8 electives out of 49. They are working on a project approved by IFHE Research committee. This is also an example of inter-departmental cooperation and coordination.

A brief description of the projects undertaken by Prof Shailendra Singh is given below.

- Vocational Rehabilitation of Persons with Disability: Case for a Person Centric Guidance For Successful Transition In To Work Life through Career Development Activities. (Oct 2014-Feb 2015)
 - At the end of this project which is funded by CBM (a German NGO) the project will enable development of IT applications for People with Disability (PwD). Once trained career aspirants can determine their vocational personality/ interest type so that they can make an effective career choice.
- The Economics And Psychology of Long-Term Savings And Pensions: A Randomized Experiment Among Low-Income Entrepreneurs In Maharashtra, India with co-investigator Karna Basu from Hunter College, City University, New York since June 2010.
 - This long term study funded (4,50,000 USD) by International Initiative for Impact Evaluation (3ie) and Department for International Development (DFID) uses Randomized Controlled Trial, to understand how certain features associated with the design and presentation of a pension product affect rates of participation and patterns of savings. In this study, 6,000 existing clients of Mann Deshi Bank (a regulated

cooperative bank run by and for women) are being contacted for coming out with some initial results on rural savings and investments. Final results are awaited.

Starting 2007, the marketing department conducts a conference titled "International Conference on Business Strategy and Marketing" (ICOMBS). The aim of this conference is to bring together academicians and practitioners with research interests in the field of marketing, strategy and business management. The conference provides a forum for disseminating new research findings, practices and techniques in marketing and exchanging ideas among academicians and practitioners to promote a better understanding of contemporary issues, challenges and solutions. Further details are given below.

ICOMBS 2010

The International Conference on Marketing and Business Strategy (ICOMBS 2010) was held during the year where around 52 national and international papers were presented. The Conference was inaugurated by Koshy Abraham, Professor (Marketing), IIM (A). Papers were presented by the industry experts, Professors from various National B-Schools & IBS Research Scholars.

ICOMBS 2012

The Department of Marketing and Strategy successfully organized the 4th International Conference during May 10-11, 2012. The theme of the conference was "Innovations in Technology – Implications for

Marketing & Business Strategy." A total of 86 papers were received, of which 72 papers were selected. A total of 68 papers were presented, out of which three were from abroad (Canada and Saudi Arabia).

ICOMBS 2013

The 5th ICOMBS was held in August 2013. In all we received 78 papers out of which only 52 were accepted. 48 papers were presented 25% of which were by faculty and scholars of IBS Hyderabad.

A committee is appointed by the Head of the Dept. consisting of senior faculty members to give feedback and evaluate courses. These members are required to give an unbiased feedback. Changes are incorporated and presented to Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) and then presented to Board of Studies (BoS) and Academic Council.

Yes.

The heads of the departments have access to faculty feedback from students. Students also give feedback on the curriculum and the Pedagogy. Wherever required, faculty members are counselled on the changes to be brought about to achieve a better fit with the course and student learning outcomes.

The department invites senior industry managers to address students who specialize in the marketing discipline. These managers address them on specific issues and a question and answer session ensues. This exposure helps students relate their learning to actual business reality. Some notable guests in 2014 include the CEOs and Senior Managers from bigbasket.com, Salesforce.com, Fractal analytics, Google etc.

45. List the teaching methods adopted by the faculty for different programmes.

Innovations in pedagogy:

Faculty members take on themselves the task of bringing in Innovations in the course. They enjoy the flexibility of designing the change as long as it focuses on the core issue. Innovations help faculty sustain the interest of students and enhance learning at the same time. Such activities also foster team skills and team spirit. Given below are some initiatives taken in select course in the Department.

- Structured **relating to a course projects** are taken up by the students in a large number of courses. These on-course projects train the students to appreciate the concepts relating to a specific subject discipline in practice.
- Students are encouraged to make **presentations** on topics of their choice within the scope of the academic contours of the program and this are intended to tickle the self learning aspect of the student's learning frame.
- **Simulations:** In order to present the students with a real-time business environment online and web based simulations have been introduced in courses such as Strategic Marketing, Customer Relationship Management, Services Marketing and B to B marketing.
- Besides teaching courses faculty members also serve as Mentors to students who seek their guidance on a range of issues pertaining to academics, extracurricular activities, personality

development, and summer internship programs etc. This activity gives the much needed scope and time to students to seek out and clarify on the many doubts that may exist in their minds.

Introduction of new electives

1. Customer Relationship Management

This course is offered as an elective in Semester 3 and Semester 4. It is a single player simulation where students define and execute a business to business marketing strategy in hypothetical marketing context. Students get the chance to analyze market segments and decide on which new customers should they acquire and retain the existing ones. Allocation of sales and marketing resources for each targeted segment includes setting the level of spending on marketing communications and market research. The link between marketing strategy formulation and effective execution is brought out in this HBS simulation.

- 2. *Online Marketing:* Advances in the online marketing area are creating new opportunities for MBA graduates. In line with the changes in the environment we took the initiative to provide our students with the knowledge about this important domain in marketing.
- 3. *Rural Marketing:* A course on rural marketing was introduced to enable students to get a feel of how products are marketed in rural India. This course further helps students to understand the contemporary best practices in rural marketing and the challenges and constraints of operating in rural markets.
- 4. *Business Strategy:* The course was condensed into one elective and enriched. A committee was appointed for this purpose and the broad outline discussed in the Board of Studies and Academic council.
- 5. Financial Services Marketing: In order to cater to the growing demand for marketing skills to students joining Financial Services a course on Financial Services Marketing was introduced. About 40 students took the course in the first year of inauguration.

Pricing simulation in Basic Marketing course

This simulation is designed for clarifying basic pricing concepts for Marketing Management students. The four stage simulation takes the students through commodity markets, Brand Building, Changes in economic conditions and changes in regulations. Teams of four students each have to compete in a hypothetical QSR market to achieve a balance of market share and profitability.

Services Marketing

The activity is about creating a service blueprint. The activity provides the students with a scope to learn and explore the concept of service blueprint on their own, without direct supervision from the teacher. As students learnt more by 'trial and error' and 'thinking', the learning became more 'sticky'. Additionally, it brings in the 'fun' element to learning.

The success of the activity goes a long way to show that one need not always resort to ICT or other advanced technologies to enable a rich case learning experience. The beauty of the Service Blueprinting activity lies in its simplicity. It shows that innovation in case teaching can be enabled even with readily available materials and simple processes, and thus, can be easily replicated in classrooms around the world.

Online Marketing

This course enables students to analyze the cutting edge business models that generate revenue for online marketers while delivering customer value. The architecture for these business models is tied to marketing theory wherever possible. During practical sessions, students are exposed to state-of-the-art contemporary demand and supply marketing metrics and analytic tools, such as Web Analytics, Google AdWords, Google AdSense, Google Double-click, Facebook analytics, Twitter analytics, Referral marketing, and other web metrics to integrate marketing performance with a firm's strategic thrust to meet corporate goals.

Integrated Marketing Communication

Advertising and marketing industry is continuously transforming, and requires people who are professional trained to take management (decision making) jobs right after steeping out from MBA colleges. Some of the sessions in this course are devoted to mini-workshops where students are professionally trained in a particular aspect of curriculum /industry needs. Some examples of these modules are - Media Planning, Market Research pre and post advertising, Evaluating Marketing Effectiveness, Tapagesing Creativity etc. This requires faculty to provide data-sets/information to the students and take them through the concepts/ decision making process much more realistically.

46. How does the department ensure that programme objectives are constantly met and learning outcomes are monitored?

Courses and curriculum are periodically assessed for relevance. Case studies are changed and fresh ones introduced keeping in mind the contemporariness. Teaching groups are formed in each course who meet at regular intervals to discuss the case studies and the theoretical inputs to be imparted in the respective sessions. Besides these initiatives

- Continuous evaluation is done through class participation, periodic tests, quiz etc. The marks/grades are immediately communicated after evaluation to the students to improve their performance.
- All faculty members are members of teaching groups (A teaching group consists of all faculty members teaching the same course in different sections). These groups meet weekly once to discuss the learning objectives of each chapter, the cases and prepare the discussion plan. In addition to cases, other pedagogical innovations are also discussed to meet the program objectives.
- As part of Mentorship Program, the faculty members counsel the students who do not score the expected marks/grades.

47. Highlight the participation of students and faculty in extension activities.

Marketing is a highly dynamic field of activity where marketing practitioners face continuous challenges. These experiences need to find a way into the classroom. In the department, faculty members ensure that marketing students are given exposure to different inputs in the area of marketing and strategy. For example In the Business to Business Marketing course student is actively encouraged to visit exhibitions and retail formats to understand the practical nuances of the course. Two such activities are given as an illustration.

Visit to PackPlus South 2013 was an assignment activity for the students of Business Marketing, Participation in the trade exhibitions is an integral part of a business-to-business marketing manager and this visit helped students to have a firsthand experience. Students had to submit a written assignment "Use of exhibitions and trade fairs for promotions and networking in B2B marketing" so that students would internalize the learning from the visit.

Similarly visit to Kids Fair 2013 was an assignment activity for the students of Brand Management. This visit would help the students to have a firsthand experience of creating brands for an important demographic segment like kids. A written assignment "Brand Building Insights" was submitted by students to internalize the learning

In the Integrated Marketing Communication and Services Marketing course student projects are evaluated by Managers from industry. Insights were provided for improvement.

Non-academic Extension activities:

a. Youth Agenda for India- (2011-13):

Friedrich-Ebert-Stiftung (FES), India is a German foundation in India working on issues related to social democracy. The YLTT performs as an advisory board to FES on how to integrate issues and concerns of youth in India in FES work effectively. Prof. Shailendra Bisht, Faculty member actively participated in conceptualizing and organizing following activities:

- 1. National Workshop on Perspective Building on Youth Policy, March 3-4, 2013, RGNIYD, Sriperumbedur, Tamilnadu.
- 2. Youth Agenda for India (YAFI), Dissemination workshop with FES India, October 26-28, 2012, New Delhi.
- 3. A Scenario Building Exercise to Develop YLTT Agenda for Youth, August 6-7, 2011, New Delhi.

b. BIG GREEN (BG) - Framework for Bringing Scale to Green Livelihood Initiatives (GLIs) (April-Oct 2014)

This research study funded by FES Climate Change Project uses a multiple case study design on scalable green livelihood initiatives guided by participatory governance in the context of climate change across five physiographic regions in India. During the Six Regional Consultations (Dharamshala, Ranchi, Coimbatore, Nagpur, Shillong and Udaipur) data was collected through panel discussions, focus group discussions, interviews and field visit. The data is being analyzed using content analysis and themes and sub themes would be developed. The unit of analysis would be Green livelihood initiative. Based on the analysis, key success factors and indicators would be identified which would be then used to create UPSCALE framework. The final dissemination of BIG Green key finding would be through a National Consultation at IBS Hyderabad on Nov 1-2, 2014.

The faculty and students participate in the lectures by eminent persons organized by the University. For details of the visits of the eminent persons, refer Self Study Report-Cycle II.

Faculty members are involved in research seminars and presentations of research work to their colleagues. This is a regular feature where every faculty member learns. This knowledge becomes very important in enriching their teaching efforts.

The Business School is accredited by SAQS. It is also rated by CRISIL and ICRA. It is in the process of seeking International Accreditation from The Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business. The eligibility application has been accepted and Prof. Colm Kearney, Dean, Monash University, Melbourne, Australia has been appointed as the Mentor.

50. Briefly highlight the contributions of the department in generating new knowledge, basic or applied.

Faculty members engage in research on diverse topics related to Marketing and Business. Over the last five years the following areas of research (see details below) were prominently pursued. This knowledge was then translated to class room discussion by faculty. Faculty members actively discuss their research work in faculty seminars which are conducted on a weekly basis. Research scholars in the department present their research proposals and members of the faculty make it a point to attend these seminars. The department of Operations and IT trains the students to have good hands-on experience with different analytical tools like MS Excel, SAS and SPSS and ERP software of SAP. This is done through teaching the subjects of Quantitative Techniques, Business Analytics and Business Process Integration. These skills enable the students carry out good analysis of the data pertaining to other subjects of Economics, Finance, HR and Marketing.

46. How does the department ensure that programme objectives are constantly met and learning outcomes are monitored?

Courses and curriculum are periodically assessed for relevance. Case studies are changed and fresh ones introduced keeping in mind the contemporariness. Teaching groups are formed in each course who meet at regular intervals to discuss the case studies and the theoretical inputs to be imparted in the respective sessions. Besides these initiatives

- Continuous evaluation is done through class participation, periodic tests, quiz etc. The marks/grades are immediately communicated after evaluation to the students to improve their performance.
- All faculty members are members of teaching groups (A teaching group consists of all faculty members teaching the same course in different sections). These groups meet weekly once to discuss the learning objectives of each chapter, the cases and prepare the discussion plan. In addition to cases, other pedagogical innovations are also discussed to meet the program objectives.
- As part of Mentorship Program, the faculty members counsel the students who do not score the expected marks/grades.

The department runs two student clubs – DoT club and Kaizen club. These clubs continuously conduct workshops, guest lectures by industry people and quizzes to share and enhance knowledge in different areas of both Operations and IT.

For the subject Engineering Graphics, explaining the concepts with solid Models, Videos and also CAD software is used. Teaching through case studies is adopted in some of the courses.

The faculty comprises competent individuals in all areas of science and engineering with rich experience in academia and industry. At present, there are 43 full-time faculty members. The number of faculty members with PhD and M.Tech qualifications is 12 and 31 respectively. There are 12 faculty members, who have registered for their PhDs with different universities. Recruitment of additional faculty members, preferably with PhD qualifications, is in progress to meet future requirements in teaching and research.

During the last four years the Faculty of Science and Technology contributed 62 research papers in national and international journals out of which twenty seven were listed with Scopus. FST conducts weekly faculty seminars on diverse topics. Industry relevant elective courses are offered to students in collaboration with multinational software companies. Faculty development programs were conducted to keep the interaction between academia and industry.
