A. About the University

1. Introduction

It is my privilege to present the Annual Report of the ICFAI Foundation for Higher Education, a deemed-to-be University u/s. 3 of the UGC Act, 1956, for 2022-23. The report covers the activities of the University for the period April 1, 2022 to March 31, 2023. This is IFHE's Fourteenth full Academic Year of operations after it was declared as a deemed-to-be University in December 2008. The University and its constituent units continue to perform well and received accolades at state and national levels.

The University submitted a Self Study Report (SSR) for 3rd cycle of accreditation to NAAC in April 2022. A six-member Peer Review Team (PRT) from NAAC visited the IFHE on September 7-9, 2022, to assess the Institution's 'quality status.' Based on the assessment, the NAAC awarded the University the highest grade, A+ +, with a cumulative grade point average of 3.59/4.00. Having secured the highest grade, the university applied for Category I autonomy status to the Ministry of Education. The change in the autonomy status from Category II awarded in 2018 to Category I is awaited. IFHE is one of the few universities in the country to have been bestowed with this distinction.

The University Grants Commission (UGC) has included the University under Section 12(B) of the UGC Act, 1956.

IFHE has always pursued AICTE approval for its management and technical programs.

The University received permission from Ministry of Education, Department of Higher Education, ICR Division, Government of India, to start an Off-Campus Centre at Bengaluru in June 2021. The Off-Campus Center received AICTE approval for the management program being offered from the Academic Year 2022-23.

IBS Hyderabad, the constituent of the IFHE received the Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business (AACSB International) Accreditation in February 2020 for the three Programs viz., BBA, MBA, and PhD in Management valid for a period of five years.

The South Asian Quality Assurance System (SAQS), Association of Management Development Institutions in South Asia (AMDISA) re-re-accredited the B-School for five more years i.e.

August 2020-September 2025 period. The B-School was the first in Asia to be accredited by SAQS in 2006. The B-School submitted its mid-term review to AMDISA, which was accepted.

The University became a member of Asia Pacific Quality Network (APQN), Shanghai.

IFHE received E-LEAD Certificate from QS I-GAUGE for the period 21 February 2022 to 21 February 2023.

The University participated in National Institutional Ranking Framework (India Rankings 2023) under management category and received 40th rank.

The University participated in EWIHER Top 300 Universities 2023-24 and was ranked 4th among India's Best Private Multidisciplinary Universities. In 2022-23 the university was ranked 5th and was ranked 9th in 2021-22. The university obtained a score of 1048, considering the score, the university is ranked 10th among Government and Private Multidisciplinary Universities. The University was ranked 1st under the State of Telangana.

The University was ranked 33rd among 35 Best Universities in the Private Sector by Careers360 Survey 2023.

ICFAI Business School (IBS), Hyderabad Participated in EWIHER India's Top 100 Private B-Schools and was ranked 5th in the country. In the previous year it was ranked 6th. In the State of Telangana, IBS bagged the 2nd position among the Top 10 Institutes for Most Popular Undergraduate Program, the BBA Program of the B-School was ranked 4th.

ICFAI Business School (IBS), Hyderabad Participated in the Times B School Rankings Survey 2023 and was ranked 3rd among Top 50 Private Business Schools.

The B-School was also ranked 3rd among top Private B-School by Careers 360 Survey 2023.

In the Business Today B-School Ranking 2023, the B-School was ranked 23rd among B-Schools in India and was ranked 4th in the South Zone.

In the Times Engineering Ranking 2023, the Faculty of Science and Technology (ICFAITech, Hyderabad) was ranked

- 10th among Top 170 Engineering Institutes Rankings 2023.
- 8th among Top 125 Private Engineering Institutes Rankings 2023
- 6th among Top Engineering Institutes in South Zone.
- Under Engineering Research Rankings 2023, it was ranked 11th among the top 30 institutes.
- Under Engineering Placements Ranking 2023, it was ranked 7th among the top 70 institutes.

In India Today Top Private Engineering College Survey 2023, Faculty of Science and Technology (ICFAITech, Hyderabad) was ranked 49th among Top Private Engineering Colleges in India and 79th among Top Private Engineering Colleges in India.

In India Today Top Law Colleges in India 2023 Survey, the ICFAI Law College was ranked 22nd among Top Law Colleges in India.

In the Careers 360 Survey 2022, the ICFAI Law School, Hyderabad was ranked 5th among Private Law Schools offering BA-LLB (H) / BBA-LLB (H) and was rated AAAA+, (the second-best Law College) in the State of Telangana, te highest rating being AAAAA.

CRISIL awarded the IBS B-School with the highest-Grade A*** rating at both the National and State levels on March 24, 2023. The validity of these Grades extends till March 23, 2024.

The University held the 11th N J Yasaswy memorial lecture on November 24, 2022. Former union minister and six-time parliament member, Sri Suresh Prabhu delivered the lecture on 'Realising Yasaswy's Vision'. During the lecture, Sri Prabhu stated "Heroes need not be politicians, business leaders, or those who wear a uniform. Leaders build sustainable societies and develop individuals. Yasaswy was a leader who dreamt of building modern India through quality education." Remembering N J Yasaswy's contribution in developing private higher education, the former union minister added that he dared to challenge the existing education system and brought-in a curriculum that was relevant to the present times. The lecture was presided over by Prof. (Dr.) C. Rangarajan, Chancellor of the University.

The University's financials, including funding, operations, income, and expenditure, are effectively managed by a team of skilled finance specialists

I wish to express my deep sense of gratitude to the UGC, AICTE, BCI, CoA and the Ministry of Education (MoE), Government of India, for their constant support in the management of our institution. We have benefited immensely from the vision of our Chancellor, Prof. (Dr.) C. Rangarajan, to whom we are grateful. We thank the Members of the Board of Management, Academic Council, Finance Committee, Planning and Monitoring Board and Boards of Studies of the University, as well as the students and their parents, the faculty and support staff and the recruiters for their valuable contributions in making this University a renowned one. Our efforts in this direction are part of a continuous process.

2. Vision & Mission

4. Statutory Approvals

Graded Autonomy: The UGC granted Category II graded autonomy to the University in April 2018. After receiving the NAAC A+ +, the university has submitted its application to Ministry of Education, Government of India, for Category I graded autonomy. The revised graded autonomy is awaited.

I2-B Status: The UGC included the University under Section 12-B of the UGC Act, 1956 in 2020.

Off-Campus: The Ministry of Education, Department of Higher Education, ICR Division, Government of India, gave permission to start an Off-Campus Centre at Bengaluru vide its notification No.F.10-5/2019-U3(A) dated 4th June 2021. The Campus has received Letter of Approval (LOA) for the MBA program for the Academic Year 2022-23 from AICTE in July 2022 and received Extension of Approval for the Academic Year 2023-24.

AICTE Extension of Approval (EOA) for Academic Year 2023-24: For the Fifth consecutive year, IFHE participated in the AICTE Approval Process and received Extension of Approval for Management and Engineering Programs for the Academic Year 2023-24. It also received approval from AICTE for offering Management Programs in Distance and Online mode. IFHE also received approval from AICTE to offer an MBA Program at the Bengaluru Campus.

The University received an Extension of Approval (EOA) for the Academic Year 2023-24 for the following Programs for its Main Campus at Hyderabad (Table 1): :

5. Accreditations

NAAC: The University submitted Self Study Report (SSR) for 3rd Cycle of Accreditation to NAAC in April 2022. A six-member Peer Review Team (PRT) from NAAC visited the campus from September 7-9, 2022, to assess the Institution's 'quality status'. The University was awarded the highest grade, A+ +, with a cumulative grade point average of 3.59/4.00.

AACSB: IBS Hyderabad was accredited by the Association to Advance Collegiate Schools of Business (AACSB International) accreditation in February 2020 for all the three Programs offered by the B-School viz., BBA, MBA, and PhD. The coveted AACSB accreditation is considered the gold standard of quality business education worldwide. The B-School has also received a commendation from the Executive Vice president and Chief Accreditation Officer of AACSB International, Stephanie M. Bryant, for achieving excellence in all areas, including teaching, research & curricula development.

SAQS: The ICFAI Business School (IBS), Hyderabad, Telangana, was re-re-accredited by SAQS, AMDISA for a period of Five Years from August 2020 to August 2025. The B-School submitted its mid-term progress report in May 2023 to AMDISA, detailing the Actions Taken Report on the three objectives we identified and the response to the suggestions made by the Peer Review Team.

The objectives identified by the Institute were (a) to improve the faculty-student ratio in line with future regulatory requirements and provide a cushion to the faculty members to devote more time to research, consultancy, executive education, and academic administration; (b) to increase the Seed-Money Support for Research and keep the window for applying open throughout the year and (c) to increase our performance under externally funded research-projects, open MDP/EDP programs, and consultancy assignments. AMDISA acknowledged the receipt of the mid-term progress report and expressed its satisfaction with the progress achieved.



Hyderabad Campus

The University, located on a sprawling 91-acre campus, is endowed with the state-of-the-art facilities to enhance the quality of teaching and learning processes.

Academic Complex: The entire academic area of the University including Faculty of Management, Faculty of Science and Technology, Faculty of Law and School of Architecture consisting of more than 17 lakh sq. ft. of built-up area, is centrally air-conditioned, networked on LAN and Wi-Fi and supported with audio, projector and smartboard facilities. In all one thousand eight hundred and twenty six (1,826) boys and one thousand seven hundred and twenty five (1,725) girls are staying in the hostels. The hostels are provided with 24 hours hot water through solar water heaters and regular water for use. RO plants provide drinking water, which is made available in the hostels through water coolers. The hostel complexes are networked with 24-hour internet facility and furnished with TVs, washing machines, water dispensers, etc.

Both the boys and girls hostels are provided with late night cafés for the use of the students during late hours.

Two separate dining complexes with six dining halls are provided to cater to the students, faculty members, and non-teaching staff for breakfast, lunch, evening snacks and dinner. These are fully equipped with modern kitchen equipment. Each dining complex has the capacity to seat approximately 700 students at a time. In addition, two pay-and-eat-a-la-carte cafeterias are also available.

a. Administrative Office: The administrative office looks after security and safety and the maintenance of the premises and equipment. It acquires physical resources and organizes events, seminars, and conferences. It also provides support to the academic office for the conduct of classes, examinations, and other academic processes. It ensures that all facilities and equipment are working and they are repaired immediately.

The administrative staff maintains records of utilization of facilities and submit monthly report. Maintenance of critical equipment is contracted to the manufacturers of the equipment.

b. Accounts Office: The accounts office deals with matters such as collection of fees from the students, disbursement of scholarships, settlement of bills for goods and services purchased and operation of bank accounts. The accounts office is headed by Finance Officer and is supported by staff. The accounts office is provided with computers with accounting software. Most of the accounting operations are computerized.

c. Faculty Accommodation: Twenty-one residential quarters are available for faculty members.

d. Clinic: The University has a two bedded clinic with three full-time doctors, a resident medical officer and five nurses. Medical facilities are available 24x7 on the campus. The doctors attend to the health needs of the students, the faculty members and the staff members. The clinic has basic medical equipment and supporting facilities and equipment. For referral as well as major health issues, IFHE has arrangements with corporate hospitals. For medical emergencies, two ambulances with four drivers are available round the clock. The doctors are provided with a PC and telephone for monitoring the health of the students and to communicate with their parents, if necessary. They maintain a database of all cases which helps them to access the medical history of the students when they come for subsequent visits.

e. Games, Sports and Recreation Facilities: The University has a common recreation room where students and staff can meet and play indoor games. The recreation rooms are equipped with chess boards, carom boards, table tennis and separate gymnasiums for boys and girls. The indoor stadium has facilities for squash and badminton.

The University has a multipurpose playground, as well as a ground for football and cricket. The ground is equipped for various outdoor sports activities including volleyball, basketball, tennis and badminton. The students are provided sports equipment when they organize inter-class/inter-college competitions. There is an Olympic size swimming pool of international standards with lifeguards standing by. These facilities are for the use of students, faculty and staff members. The University also has facilities for Salsa, Art of Living, Karate and Practicing Yoga.

Music room with all musical instruments is made available to all students.

f. Photocopying and Printing Facilities: On campus photocopying and printing facilities are available. A separate facility is provided for the students within the hostels. Similarly, students and the faculty also have access to document scanning and CD writing facilities.

g. Intranet: The University campus is Wi-Fi enabled. This facilitates organizing, planning and disseminating information effectively and efficiently. The intranet is helping to provide better services to students and facilitates and better utilization of the University's resources.

h. IT facilities: IFHE places great emphasis on the use of IT for teaching-learning and in its operations. It has deployed modern IT hardware and software on the campus. IFHE constantly upgrades its IT infrastructure to provide the state-of-art facilities for students and employees.

i. Wi-Fi Network: The total number of Wi-Fi access points installed is 1045. Three core switches, thirteen distribution switches, 120 access level switches, 120 extreme switches POE and thirty switches are also installed for covering the shadow areas (corner rooms).The network bandwidth is 3.2 GBPS. The CMD guest house is Wi-Fi enabled.

j. Server details: Twenty servers have been installed at centralized locations on the campus. UTM up-gradation is completed successfully.

k. Computing Facilities: The University has more than 1,322 computers for students' use. Most of the computers are high-end with Core i5 and i7 processors. The servers are of HP, IBM & Sun make. Thirty one PC's are installed in the Library, 45 PCs in administrative office, 288 PCs in the faculty member's cabins, cabins and 92 PCs in the language lab are provided. The other hardware in the computer centers campus includes CD/DVD Writers, Backup DAT Drives, Data Modems, Scanners, DeskJet Printers, Network Printers and LaserJet Printers. The details are presented in Table 5.

The Operating Systems used on the campus are, Windows 10 Professional and Windows 11 Professional. Server Operating Systems: Windows 2019 Server, Red Hat Linux 12 and Solaris 5.0.

The computers, provided to the faculty and staff are provided with standard office productivity software. The application software available on the campus includes MS Office 2016, Acrobat Reader 10.0, WinZip 8.0, FrontPage 2009, SQL Server and Client, Adobe Photoshop, Adobe Page Maker, Macro Media Flash, Tally and Focus. IFHE also has statistical/simulation software tools like Prowess, SPSS, SAS and Rational Rose which students and faculty use for their research and analysis work. IFHE has academic alliances with several computer software companies like Microsoft Corporation, IBM, SAS Institute, SAP, Micro World and Adobe.

I. Energy:

Generator: The University has full power supply from the public utility services as well as two generators with complete back-up facility of more than 2,000 KVA.

Usage of Solar Energy: Solar panels, installed at various places within the campus, are used to power solar water heaters. The entire hot water requirement in the hostels and mess is met through these heaters.

Conservation of Power: The Academic blocks and libraries are planned architecturally to get natural light during the daytime and are well illuminated. This has ensured that there is no wastage of power.

m. Water Supply: The University has water supply from the Hyderabad Metro Water Supply department as well as a back-up of underground water resource through 25 bore wells and a sump to store 4,00,000 liters of water to be used at any time on the campus.

The bore wells are in working condition discharging sufficient water.

Reverse Osmosis (RO) Water Treatment: The underground water is treated in the RO plant to make it potable for drinking.

Sewerage Treatment Plant (STP): The University has a Sewerage Treatment Plant which has been upgraded to treat 1,000 KLD of waste water. The sewerage is treated and water is used for watering the plants on the campus.

n. Transport: To cater to increasing number of students as well as faculty and staff members, the university has outsourced 59 buses to transport students from various destination points in the city to the campus. Three additional buses of IFHE are also deployed to cater to the needs of the students staying in the hostel.



10. Biodiversity

About 70% of the area i.e., 65 acres is devoted to biological diversity with 55% for flora and grass, 10% for fauna and 5% for human beings. They co-exist in a happy and symbiotic relationship. Infrastructure and buildings account for 20%; roads and green pathways constitute 5% and another 5% is for grounds and facilities for sports and recreation.

11. Learning Resources

The University has a central library 'Sri N J Yasaswy Memorial Library', named after the founder of the ICFAI Group. The University also has two more libraries attached to the Faculty of Science & Technology and the Faculty of Law. The three libraries are fully computerized with integrated library management software viz., Libsuite.

The spacious central library is spread over three floors, has a carpet area of 45,000 sq.ft., and is centrally air-conditioned. It has a seating capacity of 700. The two libraries at Faculty of Science and Technology and Faculty of Law have a carpet area of 6,000 sq.ft. and 5,000 sq.ft. and have a seating capacity of 60 and 50 respectively.

The library staff are professionally qualified and experienced. They maintain the library efficiently, catering to the needs of the users.

Library Holdings: The Central Library has a diverse collection of books, CD/DVDs, reports, and national/international periodicals related to all functional areas of management, economics, science & technology, law, architecture and general books. All the library activities are computerized with the help of Libsuite, the integrated library management software. The library documents are classified according to the Dewey decimal classification system. An online catalogue is maintained. This helps the students, faculty and staff to trace books easily. All the documents are bar-coded and bar-coded identity cards are issued to the users (students, faculty & staff) for borrowing the documents.

The library also subscribes to several electronic databases such as EBSCO, Emerald, Science Direct, and ProQuest, etc. Users can access these databases as well as the library catalogue (WebOPAC) through the campus intranet. Users can also access the electronic databases through Knimbus, a leading digital library platform. Photocopying facilities are also available within the library premises.

Research related software like IBM SPSS and SAS are made available to the students, scholars and faculty members. Research related books, monographs, and dissertations/theses are housed in the reference section. The latest books and revised editions in the related fields are procured every month keeping in view future requirements.

The library holds 45,590 titles, 1,02,595 books and 23,900 e-books and 7,873 other holdings. It has subscribed to 127 journals, both national and international. It has also subscribed to 15 international magazines, 97 Indian magazines and three national e-magazines. The details are present in Table 6.

New Technology Infrastructure

The lecture theatres and classrooms were enhanced with state-of-art hardware and software technologies. All the lecture theatres and classrooms are provided with centralised AC and Interactive Touch screen LG smartboards. A hand wireless microphone, one collar wireless UHF microphone and one DSP (Digital Signal Processor) Sennheiser make are installed along with each of these Interactive Touch Screen LG panels. Apart from the state-of-the-art equipment as given above, each classroom has two/three CCTV cameras, depending on the size of the room, to monitor the class. One overhead projector per class room is also present.

The University provides 24x7 Wi-Fi connectivity on the campus. Students have the option of using the internet anywhere on the campus. The IT lab is equipped with the latest software and hardware. The institute has 3.2 GBPS internet bandwidth for the use of students and faculty members. The internet facility has been provided to all the students for their academic and research work. Computers are provided to all the teaching staff in their rooms. Research related software such as SPSS, SAS, IBM Rational Rose, etc., is available.

Student Information Management System

The Student Information Management System (SIMS) provides information on schedules of classes, examinations and events, syllabuses of courses, information about students and faculty members, etc. It is being used by the students to communicate with each other, run opinion polls, post articles and news about the campus, and create a market to buy and sell items. Some of the salient features of the Intranet are as follows:

- Using the Intranet, students can choose elective courses online. If a course is not offered because only a few students were interested in it, the software does not allow students to choose that course. Similarly, the software does not allow students to choose courses for which they are not eligible.
- IFHE uses the SIMS to enhance the learning experience of students using the latest educational technology. All academic activities including evaluation are done using this facility, which is supported by Wi-Fi and advanced IT labs.
- The Intranet has a link to the library database. The students and faculty can check the availability of books in the library.
- The University has various academic, cultural, social and environment clubs. Each club has its own website. The clubs use websites to announce the activities, events and competitions organized by them; to get nominations for competitions; and to announce the results of the competitions. After an event is over, students upload photographs of the event and put up a report about the event. Students also use social media platforms to reach out to their cohorts both within and outside the campus.

Bengaluru Campus

The Off-Campus at Bengaluru, located on 22.36 acres, is endowed with the best facilities to enhance the quality of teaching-learning processes. State-of-the-art infrastructure available at the campus meets the requirements of the programs conducted. Details of physical infrastructure of the campus are provided in Table 8. Details of academic infrastructure are furnished in Table 9.

The infrastructure available at the campus is detailed below:

Academic Complex: The entire academic area of the campus is centrally air-conditioned, networked on LAN and Wi-Fi and supported with audio, projector and smart-board facilities.

Administrative Office: The administrative office looks after security, safety, and the maintenance of the premises and equipment. It acquires physical resources and organizes events, seminars and conferences. It also supports the academic office for conducting classes, examinations and other academic processes. It ensures that all facilities and equipment are working and they are repaired on timely basis.

The administrative staff maintains records of utilization of facilities and submits monthly report. Maintenance of critical equipment is contracted to the manufacturers of the equipment.

Accounts Office: The accounts office deals with matters such as collection of fees from the students, disbursement of scholarships, settlement of bills for goods and services purchased and operation of bank accounts. The accounts office is headed by Finance Officer and is supported by staff. The accounts office is provided with computers with accounting software. Most of the accounting operations are computerized.

Clinic: The clinic has basic medical equipment and supporting facilities. The doctors attend to the health needs of the students, the faculty members and the staff members. The doctors are provided with a computer and telephone facility for monitoring the health of the students and to communicate with their parents, if necessary. They maintain a database of all cases which helps them to access the medical history of the students during their subsequent visits.

Games, Sports and Recreation Facilities: The Off-campus has a multipurpose playground, as well as a ground for football and cricket. The ground is equipped for various outdoor sports activities including volleyball, basketball, tennis and badminton. The students are provided sports equipment when they organize inter-class/inter-college competitions.

The campus has a recreation room where students and staff can meet and play indoor games. The recreation rooms are equipped with chess boards, carom boards, table tennis and badminton.

Photocopying and Printing Facilities: On campus a photocopying machine and 14 printers. Students and faculty have access to document scanning facility.

Intranet: The entire campus is Wi-Fi enabled.

IT facilities: The campus is enabled with Internet Bandwidth of 355 mbps capacity.

Energy: The University has full power supply from the public utility services as well as two generators with a capacity of 500 KVA DG Set 2020 model and 250 KVA DG Set 2012 model, both are of Krilosker make.

Water Supply: The campus has general water supply from government department as well as a back-up of underground water resource through 4 bore wells.

Sewerage Treatment Plant (STP): The campus has Sewerage Treatment Plant which treats 75 KLD (ltr) of waste water. The sewerage is treated and water is used for watering the plants on the campus.


The university offers quality programs in Management, Science & Technology, Law, Social Sciences, and Architecture. The university uses cutting edge curriculum with industry orientation that would groom the students to seek gainful employment as well as explore entrepreneurial opportunities.

Faculty of Management (IBS Hyderabad)

Faculty of Management, which is popularly known as IBS Hyderabad, offers three-year first-degree program BBA, two-year program MBA and Executive MBA, and PhD program in full-time and part-time.

The BBA Program


During the Academic Year 2022-23, 1042 students were admitted. The number of students pursuing the program during the last three years is presented in Figure 1.



The MBA Program

The flag-ship MBA Program equips the students with the skills, knowledge and strategic perspectives essential for business leadership around the world. IBS Hyderabad has adopted the case-based learning method, state-of-the-art infrastructure, emphasis on acquiring practical skills, establishing strong industry interface culminating in getting excellent placements for all its MBA graduates.

Management case studies form an integral part of the curriculum in leading B-Schools globally. Case studies describe the situation faced by practicing managers in a narrative form and provide the necessary supporting information to involve students in the decision-making process. These case studies



encourage students to think of the possible ways of handling various situations and help them learn the complexities of decision-making in business. The case studies also make them aware of the challenges that managers face every day at work. Almost all the courses in IBS Hyderabad are designed keeping in mind the advantages of case-based teaching. Each topic in a particular course is mapped with business case. More than 811 different cases are studied, analysed, and discussed by the students in a two-year program.

During the Academic Year 2022-23, 1320 students were admitted. The number of students pursuing the program during the last three years is presented in Figure 2.

Internship Program

The Summer Internship Program (SIP) is an important and integral component of the MBA Program. It is an attempt to bridge the gap in the students' perception between academics and the corporate world. Under this program, students undertake a 12-week rigorous internship program at an organization during the intervening period between close of Semester II and commencement of Semester III. It requires students to undergo the rigors of a professional environment, both in form and substance. SIP exposes the students to technical skills and helps them to acquire social skills by drawing them into contact with real professionals. The internship is a simulation of the real work environment. Students are guided by faculty members from the IBS Hyderabad and by a company executive under whom the student undergoes internship. Both will assess the performance of the student.

The Executive MBA

The program is designed specifically for working executives with a minimum of three years of experience at supervisory/managerial level. It offers them the flexibility to acquire a management qualification without leaving their present jobs/work assignments. The unique case-based pedagogy complements the other traditional and innovative methods of course delivery. Specific projects are also built-in to course delivery to enable optimal absorption of knowledge imparted.

The Executive MBA Program has good composition of senior and mid-level corporate professionals working with blue chip companies.

The Ph.D. Program

The University offers a Ph.D. program in Management, both in full-time and part-time mode. The full-time program is campus-based and designed for students interested in management teaching, research, and consultancy. The Ph.D. program is modeled on the lines of the Ph.D. programs offered by American universities, with the best practices of Indian universities blended in. It is unique and rigorous. The main objectives of the program are to:

- Develop management teachers well equipped with the skills required to educate business school students.
- Develop bright young academicians with research skills to conduct research in contemporary business management.

The program has five phases: Doctoral Coursework, Pedagogical training, Qualifying Examination, Preparation of Research Proposal and Thesis Work. At present, there are

50 students in the full-time program. The program duration is four years.

The part-time Ph.D. Program in Management is designed for practicing corporate executives and faculty members who aspire to become thought leaders in academic research. The part-time Ph.D. program works almost similarly to the full-time Ph.D. Program. The coursework is completed over a period of two years, and the candidate is expected to make eight visits to campus for nine days each. The processes related to Ph.D. qualifying examination, thesis proposal submission and approval and thesis submission and viva voce are the same as the full-time Ph.D. program. The majority of students are from middle- and senior-level positions in their organizations. A few are entrepreneurs as well. Currently, 88 students are at various stages of their Ph.D. program.

To date 87 Ph.D. were awarded by the University.

Departments

The faculty of management has Finance & Accounting, Marketing & Strategy, HR & Soft Skills and Operations & IT departments.

Finance & Accounting

The Department has faculty members with professional qualifications like CFA, FRM, CA, CS ICWA. The department has a rich combination of academic and industry experience.

The major thrust areas in which research activities are being pursued are - Dynamics and price discovery in Equity, Commodity and Derivative Markets, Insider Trading and Market Efficiency, Algorithmic and High-Frequency Trading, Corporate Governance, Microfinance, Financial Inclusion, Islamic Finance, Sustainable Finance, FinTech, Financial Regulation and Liberalization, Mergers and Acquisitions, Capital Structure Decisions, Financial Risk Management, Basel norms, Tunnelling in Business Groups, Intellectual Capital and Firm Valuation, Mutual Funds, Dividend Policy, etc.

Faculty members of the Department published research papers in reputed peer-reviewed National and International journals such as Energy Economics, IIM Management Review, Applied Economics, Journal of Behavioural and Experimental Finance, Journal of International Financial Markets, Institutions and Money, Journal of Cleaner Production, Emerging Markets Review, Economics Letters, International Journal of Managerial Finance, International Review of Economics and Finance, The World Economy, etc. Besides, faculty members have published many books and book chapters/articles in original/edited books, conference proceedings etc.

The Department brings out three peer-reviewed journals titled IUP Journal of Applied Finance, IUP Journal of Accounting Research and Audit Practices and IUP Journal of Financial Risk Management. The faculty from the department actively generate and participate in corporate training and have conducted training for CEPTAM/DRDO, BEL and have taken sessions to probationary civil servants on Project Finance at Lal Bahadur Shastri National Academy of Administration (LBSNAA) Mussoorie, Uttarakhand.

Human Resources & Soft Skills

The Department of Human Resources & Soft Skills is multidisciplinary, comprising human resource management, soft skills trainers, and psychologists with multi-culture

perspectives that extend OB, HRM, and soft skills teaching in undergraduate, postgraduate, and Ph.D. programs.

The Department engages in contemporary and quality research in the thrust areas of Positive Organizational Behavior and Scholarship, Leadership and Change Management, Talent Management, Employment Laws, Employer Branding, HR Tech & Analytics, etc. The research quality has seen a quantifiable improvement in the Year-on-Year increase in publications in reputed National and International peer-reviewed journals indexed in databases such as Scopus, ABDC, and UGC CARE.

Apart from research publications, the faculty members also contribute to the Case Research Center by developing case studies which are mapped to the courses offered. They are involved in publishing books and book chapters which have seen a considerable increase in numbers year-on-Year.

The Department organizes an International Conference annually that attracts research contribution from scholars and academicians from India & abroad. The Department brings out four peer-reviewed journals - IUP Journal of Organizational Behavior, IUP journal of Soft Skills, IUP Journal Management Research and IUP Journal of Corporate Governance, and one magazine, the HRM Review. The IUP Journal of Organizational Behaviour is listed in UGC-CARE list of journals.

Marketing & Strategy

The Department of Marketing & Strategy specializes in different cross-functional areas of business management. Core areas of research in the department include Place Branding, Consumer Brand Relationships, Marketing Technology, Societal Marketing, Green Marketing, Entrepreneurship and Services Marketing. Faculty have actively contributed to case writing and have received the highest possible recognition at the global level. They regularly involve in Faculty and Management Development programs besides generating internships for students and contributing to institution building activities.

The Department brings out a quarterly journal the IUP Journal of Business Strategy, published by the ICFAI University Press.

Operations & IT

The Department four discipline verticals viz., Operations Management, Information Technology, Analytics & Innovative Technology and Healthcare Management.

With the industry moving towards digital tools and platforms, an emphasis on pedagogy change too is evident. Faculty members adopt innovative approaches in course instruction and student evaluation. In subjects like Business Analytics, Project Management, Business Intelligence and Analytics and almost all analytics courses contemporary industry technology tools and software packages are used for data analysis and visualization including R, Python, SAS, MS-Excel, MS-Project, MS-Power Bi, Tableau, etc. These tech-tools and software packages are also incorporated in the course delivery plan.

The major thrust areas in which research activities are being pursued are Supply Chain Management, Information Technology, Project Management, Information Security, e-Governance, Analytics and Decision Support Systems. Faculty members of the department have published research papers in reputed peer reviewed national and international journals such as Information and Management, Intelligent Information Systems, Business Theory and Practice, Requirements

Engineering, Information Technology, etc. Besides, the faculty members have published many books and chapters/articles in original/edited books, conference proceedings etc. The Department brings out a peer-reviewed journal titled IUP Journal of Knowledge Management.

The Executive MBA

The program is designed specifically for working executives with a minimum of three years of experience at supervisory/managerial level. It offers them the flexibility of acquiring a management qualification without having to leave their present jobs/work assignments. The unique case-based pedagogy complements the other traditional and innovative methods of course delivery. Specific projects are also built-in to enable optimal absorption of knowledge imparted.

The Executive MBA Program has good composition of senior level and middle level corporate professionals working with blue chip companies. Twelve executives comprising of 3 women and 9 men joined the program during the academic year 2022-23.

Week-end MBA

Twenty-Three executives comprising of 16 men and 5 women are pursuing the program.

Faculty of Social Sciences

The ICFAI Foundation for Higher Education (IFHE) inaugurated Faculty of Social Sciences on March 23, 2023. The Faculty of Social Sciences (FOSS), is a constituent of the ICFAI Foundation for Higher Education, a deemed to be University established under section 3 of UGC Act, 1956. It seeks to be recognized nationally and internationally as a fine example of an institution producing young talent with immense potential for (a) demonstrating transformative impacts on Indian society to bring about changes that will align with the ideals of the constitution of India, and (b) influencing global conventions focused on realizing sustainability, through persistent and dedicated efforts in education, training, research, and extending intellectual services.

The school offers distinctive, high value education programs at the under-graduate and post-graduate levels, and promote high quality research at the masters and doctoral degree levels.

Currently, the Faculty of Social Sciences offers a 3-years BA undergraduate, a 2-year MA postgraduate degree programs in Economics, and a doctoral research program leading to a PhD in Economics.


Towards internationalizing higher education, a 4-years BA Economics program leading to an undergraduate degree with Honors or Honors with Research is offered from the 2023-24 academic year.

Going forward, the school proposes to offer double-degree programs leading to BA Economics with Psychology (Behavioural Economics), or Law, or Data Analytics, or Management. Similarly, it plans to come up with innovative programs in other fields of Social Sciences such as Psychology, Political Science, Public Policy/Administration, Sociology, Social Work, Sustainability Studies, etc.

The faculty members of Social Sciences have conducted quality research funded by national and international agencies. They publish the research output in reputed national and international journals and in books. With due emphasis on

world-class research, the school plan to collaborate with a range of national and international institutes and organizations while evolving as a center of eminence in the field of social science education and research.



B.Tech. Program


The University established the Faculty of Science and Technology (FST) after obtaining UGC's approval in May 2010 and is offering 4-year B.Tech. Program from the academic year 2010-11. The B.Tech. Program in Civil Engineering, Computer Science and Engineering, Artificial Engineering & Data Sciences, Electronics & Communication Engineering and Mechatronics, and three years program in basic sciences. Faculty members are engaged in research broadly in the areas such as image processing, wireless communications, power systems and fuzzy logic, data and web mining techniques, network security, object oriented systems and adaptive algorithms, parallel processing and real time systems, ferrite composite materials, nonlinear dynamics, quantum computations, mathematical physics, semiconducting oxide glasses, organic synthesis of molecules of medicinal importance, coordination chemistry, soil structure interaction, slope stability problems in civil engineering, semi-rings, algebraic geometry, number theory and robotics.

B.Sc. Program

The B.Sc. Program is a 3-Year Program offered with a view to impart in depth knowledge and broad understanding in the areas sciences. The details of number of student's on-campus in B.Sc. program are given in Figure-5



Ph.D. Program in Science and Engineering

The Faculty of Science and Engineering offers Doctoral Program in the areas of Basic Sciences, Engineering and Technology. The Ph.D. program is rigorous, multidisciplinary and broad in scope. Students are provided research training, encouraged to attend conferences and publish their research work. The program has four phases – course work, qualifying examination, defense of research proposal and thesis work and submission. To date six students were awarded Ph.D.

Faculty of Law


The University established the Faculty of Science and Technology (FST) after obtaining UGC's approval in May 2010. The Faculty of Law through its 5-year integrated law program imparts interdisciplinary knowledge which has a blend of management, law and IT. It has 54 core courses and 20 elective courses. The Faculty of Law offers 5-Year Integrated BBA-LLB (Hons.), 5-Year Integrated BA-LLB (Hons.), 1-Year LLM Program in Corporate and Commercial Laws and in Tax Laws, Ph.D. Program bot in Full-time and Part-time mode and Eight Certificate Courses in the areas of Cyber Law, Infrastructure Law, Law of Financial Services, Immigration Law, Solid Waste Management and Law, International Trade Law, Forensic Science & Law and Goods& Service Tax Law. It has adopted choice based credit system and offers flexibility to the students to choose the courses of their choice.

The students are trained in moot courts and mock trials on a continuous basis to improve their analytical reasoning, legal aptitude, advocacy skills and to understand the relationship between the bar and the bench. This apart, regular guest lectures and interfaces with eminent persons from the


judiciary, members of the legal fraternity, academicians and other public authorities are organized for the students.



Enrolment of student in Certificate Programs



Internship

The undergraduate programs have five Summer Legal Internships running into six weeks each. The Legal Internship forms an important component of education in the Faculty of Law. It is an attempt to bridge the gap between the professional world and academics and a vehicle for introducing the students to real-life situations. The students of BBA-LLB (Hons.) undertake the internship program at the end of each year. They are sent to Law Firms, Advocate Offices, Offices of High Court and Supreme Court Judges, Corporate Offices, NGOs, Consumer Forums and Human Rights Commissions. During their internship, the students are encouraged to take up assignments which are multidisciplinary, goal-oriented, time-bound and involve team work. The internship helps the students to apply the concepts learnt in the classrooms to real-life situations.

ICFAI School of Architecture

The ICFAI School of Architecture (ISArch), a constituent of IFHE, is approved by the Council of Architecture. The University, after getting the necessary approval from the Council of Architecture and AICTE in August 2018, established the ICFAI School of Architecture (ISArch) to offer the 5-year B. Arch Program effective from the academic year 2018-19. ISArch is at present offering the five-year B.Arch. Program in the area of Building Architecture.



The Center for Distance and Online Education (CDOE)

The Center for Distance and Online Education (CDOE) at IFHE was established in the year 2021. CDOE offers the MBA program through both the Online and Distance Education mode and the BBA program through the Distance Education mode. Students are admitted twice a year, once in January and the second time in June. Currently, we have around 1000 students across all the batches and programs. The first batch of Online MBA students passed out in April 2023. They will get their degrees in the forthcoming convocation. The details of students enrollment in the programs offered through ODL and Online are presented in Table 15 & 16.

15. Faculty Seminars

The Centre has been receiving the MoEFCC, Government of India, sponsored training programme to impart training to the Senior Indian Forest Service Officers nominated by MoEFCC from different parts of the States since 2018 and have successfully completed four such training programmes on various topics viz, Environment protection and forest conservation, Joint Forest Management: Issues and Challenges and Intellectual Property Rights: Forest and Trade.

1. One week compulsory training programme for the senior Indian Forest Service Officers on the topic " Intellectual Property Rights and WTO Accountability: Scope of Patenting" from 6th - 10th June, 2022

3. Received a consultancy project for Policy Research Study on "Guidelines under Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 for Diversion of Privately owned Forest for Non- Forest Use" on Dec 15, 2022
4. Adopt a Bird project for three months from March- April, 2023

C. Centre of Excellence for Cyber Law and Data Protection

The objectives of the Centre:

- To enhance the awareness about the ever-increasing cyber crimes in the society and provide inputs to the students and general public about safe and efficient handling of the social media,
- To provide inputs to use internet, mobile phones, ATM Cards and confidential information securely,

- To promote research in the area of cyber and data protection law and make suggestions for Cyber and Data Protection Policy, updating the existing laws,

- To develop technically skilled manpower in the area of cyber law and Cyber forensics,
- To arrange the frequent interactions of students and faculty with the cyber computer forensic experts and cybercrime investigators,
- To arrange the quiz and essay writing competitions to the students and working groups to highlight the problems that are cropping up in the area of cybercrimes and data protections,
- To organize the Hackathons to promote the creative idea generation and grounding the start-ups in the area of Cyber law and Data Protection,

18. IFHE Incubation Cell/Entrepreneurship Cell

IFHE’S IIEC:

The ICFAI Foundation for Higher Education Innovation & Entrepreneurship Council (IIEC) was established as a section 8 company which functions as a business Incubator for startups. The IIEC organizes a series of programs aimed at encouraging enthusiastic ideators to validate their ideas and prototypes and thus create successful start-up’s.

Services offered by Incubator

1. Capacity Building: These consist of webinars, seminars, workshops, mock ideation contests, business plan contests and other activities. The IIEC conducts these in collaboration with IFHE’s IIC. Customized activities can also be conducted for other Institutions as per need.
2. Business Incubation: The IIEC offers facilities for incubation in both physical and virtual mode. Under physical incubation, the following facilities are provided either on dedicated or shared basis:
 - Shared workspace
 - Internet and Wi-Fi access
 - Meeting and conference room facilities
 - Electronics laboratory facilities
 - Mechanical tool room engineering facilities
 - Library and computer laboratory facilities
 - Canteen and pantry facilities
 - Printing, scanning and photocopying
3. Investor Connect: The IIEC has investors empanelled with it with the capacity to invest in different ticket sizes. Periodic investor connect meets are organized to facilitate startups to discuss possible investment options with our empanelled investors
4. IP & Trademark Services: The IIEC has its in-house IP facilitation services operating from the Centre of Excellence for Intellectual Property in the ICFAI Law School. It also has external service providers who can be called on for providing the service to interested parties.
5. Mentorship: The IIEC has a highly experienced pool of mentors from within the faculties of the different schools of IFHE. This apart, there are several industry mentors also empanelled with the IIEC. The mentors come from across domains and sectors and ensure the best possible guidance for startups to become successful business entities.
6. Network Connect: The IIEC, along with the IFHE, brings to the table a vast network of alumni, industry partners, R&D institutions, academic partners and co-innovation partners. This powerful network allows the incubatees a broad scope for seeking professional services, consultancy and markets. Our Co-innovation partners also collaborate to share services and facilities, thus ensuring a near hassle-free journey in the path of entrepreneurship.
7. Support Services: The IIEC has a host of service providers who are empanelled and willing to provide vital services that meet the startups requirements.
 - Accounting, Finance and Bookkeeping
 - Company registrations, Income Tax and GST filing
 - Legal, regulatory and IPR services
 - IT, ITeS, website development and maintenance
 - Digital marketing and e-commerce
 - HR staffing solutions
8. Consultancy services: Consultancy services from the IIEC are primarily of five types.
 - Detailed Project Report preparation.
 - Investor pitch preparation and training
 - Go to Market (GTM) strategy preparation
 - Financial strategy and planning
 - Scale-up strategy planning

Activities and Achievements of The IFHE's IIEC:

- Ahaava:** The Hackathon Challenge program is conducted twice every year in coordination with IFHE's IIC. Ideas selected in Ahaava will then be developed to possibly go into the next two programs of the Incubator. The IIEC also invites non-IFHE entities to participate in the Ahaava program.
- Anvikshana:** This is the pre-Incubation program. It is designed to be comprehensive so that participants in this program clearly identify the key parameters in validating their idea to create a Proof Of Concept (PoC). Interventions are done periodically to assess the ideas and course corrections, therefore, become easy. Anvikshana program runs for 6 months. Entry into the Anvikshana program is from Ahaava. However, ideas from non-IFHE are also be selected into this program through a general call.
More than 35 startups were groomed through this program in the first cohort of Anvikshana out of which 10 participants made it to the final presentation stage. Industry experts mentored the startups through out the program. IIEC has collaborated with the Wadhvani Foundation and is running the popular NEN-Ignite program as a part of Anvikshana. In February 2023, the first cohort of ideators joined the program. The cohort saw 24 entries from which 10 participants made it to the final presentation stage.
- Udvikaasa:** This is the Incubation program. Ideas that come through the Anvikshana program will be evaluated for selection into the Udvikaasa program. The Udvikaasa program provides one-on-one mentoring for each startup idea for a focused march towards creating a successful venture. The startup teams in this program are given all support services in this endeavour. They are also linked to investors and other relevant members of the Incubator's network. Though entry into the Udvikaasa program is through the Anvikshana program, parallel entries will also be accepted into this program through a general call for proposals. Duration is approximately 2 years.
10 startups from the 1st cohort of Anvikshana program were selected to udvikaasa based on the progress during the program and recommendations of the Jury apart from 3 startups already incubated and the number is expected to increase given that at least 3 potential startups would emerge from each cohort of the Anvikshana program.
- Pravega:** Startups already in the market who are looking to scale up are encouraged to apply to this program. Under Pravega, services like Investor and network connect, strategy mentoring and market access are provided to the startup.



The IFHE's IIC proposes to maintain the same quantum of activity in the coming years. In December 2021, the ICFAI Foundation for Higher Education Innovation & Entrepreneurship Council (IIEC) came into existence. In the coming years, with the IIEC conducting activities in joint collaboration with the IFHE's IIC – especially where capacity building is concerned – the number of activities will only go up further.



Consultancy Services

Consultancy services are offered by the IIEC in the fields of Fund raise, DPR preparation, Pitch Deck guidance, Scaleup strategies, Valuation, Financial diligence, modeling etc. Two startups are being helped for fund raise.

It is proposed that during the next 5 years, a few masters-level programs in Innovation and Entrepreneurship domain could be introduced. Some of the courses that are proposed are from among the following:

Externships and Internships:

With an eye on encouraging students to learn from the industry and startups, the IFHE's IIC started the Externship and Internship program. The program is designed to provide as many opportunities as possible for students to experience 'learning by doing.' While internships have academic credits attached to them and are available only for certain set of students at a particular time of the year, externships are available to anyone at any time. Externships are particularly designed to allow students to learn by solving industry problems even as they are involved with their regular academic work. Students will spend a limited number of hours on the industry problem and learn even as they solve under the joint mentorship of the industry mentor as well as the faculty mentor. Students can pick up as many such externship assignments as they can handle and thus acquire as much valuable industry exposure to contemporary technologies and scenarios as possible. The program particularly encourages startups and MSMEs as collaborating partners in this effort so that students get the best possible learning experience through the ecosystem of I & E. 39 internships were offered.

Student Clubs:

There are a total of 4 student clubs across the schools of IFHE. The student I & E clubs play an active role in taking up various activities to encourage student interest in the domain of I & E. They also conduct several awareness programs in the campus through webinars, mock ideation challenges and mock Hackathons. Presently, the following clubs are active:

CONFLUX- The Panel Discussion




The alumni thoroughly completed the evaluation process and made sure that the best deserving students were chosen for the IBSAF awards. The alumni that were involved in the process were:



75 pc companies to vanish or merge or bankrupt by 2027 end: Sheth

Hyderabad, May 26 (UNI) Renowned Scholar and Internationally recognized thought leader Prof Jagdish Sheth predicted that 75 percent of the companies will vanish or merge or be bought out or bankrupt by the end of 2027.

Prof Sheth, while delivering a talk on "Why good companies fail?" at the 57th WiseViews Leadership Conversations conducted by ICFAI here on Friday evening, stated that Good companies fail when they fail to adapt to the changing trends.

Renowned scholar, who gave a detailed presentation about the core reasons behind the failure of the successful companies, said that the average lifespan of the companies was 61 years in the 1950's and presently it has come down to under 18 years.

He gave some examples of good companies like Kodak, Monsanto, which had ended abruptly due to adapting wrong habits.

Sheth elaborated that "denial, arrogance, complacency, competence dependence, competitive myopia, volume obsession and internal turf wars are the seven bad habits that ruin the success of good companies."

It is the duty of the CEO of the Company to identify the root cause of its downfall and immediately initiate corrective measures to arrest the slide", he added.

Sheth also warned that "there is no cure to the bad habit and it should be prevented at entry level to avoid big damage".

Answering a query, the recognized thought leader advised, "obsession to learn, energize the people and it is the quality that all young entrepreneurs should acquire to become a successful business man".

Reimagination of accreditation and assessment is need of the hour, Prof M K Sridhar, at ICFAI



"In days to come accreditation is going to be critical component of discussion and research. We need to gear up ourselves" said Prof. M K Sridhar, President of Centre for Educational and Social Studies (CESS) and Founder Chancellor, Channarayana University, Karnataka. He was the keynote speaker in a program to release a report titled "National Educational Policy 2020: Accreditation as an Enabler of Regulation in Higher Education" at ICFAI Foundation for Higher Education, Hyderabad. The report was prepared by ICFAI and CESS.

Prof Sridhar said that accreditation is a reliable way to enable regulation and the report has taken an in depth look at regulation. He said that the NEP needs many such studies probing different dimensions, as real analysis comes with such studies. He called for attention on the limited accreditation with only 20% of the institutes going for accreditation. "For any change to take place it needs to be at the macro level, at the intermediate level and at the micro level. At the macro level the NEP has set the guidelines, in the intermediate level the policy to clear about different bodies and frameworks. When it comes to micro level which is very important and critical to see how micro units take challenge to gear themselves to bring about changes. Real quality comes from efforts that at the micro level" added Prof Sridhar.

Dr Gurthi Laxman, Joint National Organizing Secretary, Athira Bharathiya Mahila Shaikshika Maha Sangh said that NEP 2020 is a game changer and it has addressed issues like strengthening the roots on which the Indian education system was built and charting the young generation towards the right path. He said that it is the responsibility of all the stakeholders need to rise to the expectations of the policy.

Dr B E Madhukar, Former Advisor, National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) introduced the research report. Presenting the report he said that different aspects of regulation like low structure, low courses, intake of students have been addressed by accreditation in the last five years. He highlighted the fact that though there are several accreditation bodies in the country, there are discrepancies in ranks and rating given by these agencies.

Dr Madhukar also said that based on recommendations of NEP a cross-accrediting body called National Accrediting Council (NAC) will be set up to ensure adherence to Higher Education regulation, and for transformation of affiliated colleges to autonomous colleges. He said that the report also suggested a course of action for NAC with mandatory and variable parts of accreditation. The mandatory part looks at the regulation requirements, and the variable part looks at quality and standards. This has to be done by Accrediting Agencies, and institutes will have a choice to choose the agency, he said.

Dr Sridha Ravi Vasanth, Chairperson ICFAI Society released the Research report. Dr J Mahalingam Prudh, Vice-Chancellor, ICFAI in his welcome address spoke about the achievements of the University in teaching, research, publications and accreditation. He said that the university emphasizes on the overall development of the faculty and funds many projects that faculty initiate.

"The culprits should not be bailed out with impunity": Prof. Camille Gibson, at "ICFAI Law School Intl Conference"

15, September, 2022: ICFAI Law School, constituent of ICFAI Foundation for Higher Education, Deemed University, Hyderabad has organized the Three Day International Conference on the topic: "Legal Contours of Victimology: Theory and Practice" in collaboration with Indian Society of Victimology from 14th September to 17th September, 2022 at its campus. The knowledge partners for the conference were, NALDE, Patiala, TGS Mumbai, and Maricopa/University of Arizona.

The Chief Guest Prof. (Dr) Camille Gibson, Professor of Justice, Prairie State ABM University, Texas, U.S. in the inaugural session discussed about the victimology from the perspective of bystanders. She also stressed upon streamlining the law and its implementation in its true spirit. She also emphasized that the culprits should not be bailed out with impunity. She also discussed about the rape (disputes) involving in US leading to the restoration of faith in the light of recent trends in hate crime against the Black People.

Another Chief Guest Prof. BS Bajaj, Vice-Chancellor, Biju Gandhi National University of Law, Patiala discussed the various provisions of law highlighting the latest cases cited by Supreme Court of India and respect to the rights of victims besides discussing the efficacy of the guidelines issued by the Supreme Court in the above context. He has also touched upon the recent trends in victimization of women in cyber space in the light of recent amendments and leading judgements of Supreme Court. He has also focused on secondary victimization by the law enforcement authorities and how there is need of re-looking into the criminal justice system.

More so with regard to victim rights and victim justice in the adversarial of the criminal justice system. The conference aimed to bring together businesses on various aspects of the subject of Victimology.

Provisions of CrPCode explicitly provide that the accused must be provided with all the statements registered by victims, without FBI copy etc. but there is no provision which mandates the need that victim must also be informed about the developments at every stage of criminal justice system.

High Inflation in the US led to the fall of Indian Rupee: C Rangarajan

Rangarajan spoke about the theoretical underpinnings of inflation and why it continues at an ICFE seminar.

High inflation in the US has had a repercussion on the Indian Rupee rate, according to former RBI Governor C Rangarajan, who is also the Chairman of the ICFE Foundation for Higher Education (IHF-EL) Hyderabad. He was delivering a lecture virtually at a seminar organized by ICFE on inflation and its control.

Due to high inflation, the US Fed increased the interest rates. This made the US market attractive to investors from the US, who exited the Indian market to invest their capital in the US. This led to the fall of the rupee against the US dollar," he further explained. He also noted that the steps required to control inflation are the same as those needed to control speculation in the rupee value.

Inside inflation

In his lecture, Rangarajan spoke about the theoretical underpinnings of inflation, monetary, and debt, to control inflation. He said that inflation does not mean an increase in price of select commodities but an increase in general prices. Discussing the two dominant theories of inflation—demand-pull inflation, and cost-push inflation, he quoted theorists who said, inflation is both cost-pushed and demand-pulled, and others who said one type of inflation leads to another.

Further, Rangarajan addressed the audience about inflation in India and said that inflation has been fluctuating and reached 4.8 per cent by October 2022, which was beyond the comfort zone. He said that the government has brought down the repo rate during the pandemic to stimulate the economy and improve liquidity, with inflation growing, the repo rate was raised, and with the increase, all other interest rates in the system also increased. Consequently, there was tightening of credit.

Unintended consequences

Rangarajan also said that though the recent increase in inflation was attributed mainly to increasing of prices in the wake of the ongoing Russia-Ukraine war, it is just a partial explanation.

Rangarajan further added that inflation has now become a worldwide phenomenon, and in the US, inflation reached 7.1 per cent in June 2022, a magnitude that was not witnessed in several decades. Even the UK is facing high inflation, which was beyond 11 per cent in October 2022. He said that there is a common factor that led to rising inflation across the world, which was Covid-19.

At that time, every country was advised to increase the government to stimulate the economy operating at a low level. In the US, practically every household was given money, leading to an increase in government expenditure and a high fiscal deficit. The same is seen in other countries, including India. The general price level increased, causing inflation.

With 8-9 per cent growth, it takes 20 years for India to become developed nation: Ex-RBI chief

HYDERABAD: Noting that the achievement of USD 5 trillion economy is a short term 'aspirational goal,' former RBI Governor C Rangarajan on Saturday said even after that India will still be known as middle income country with per capita income USD 2472.

Rangarajan further said in order to reach the level of an upper middle-income country, it will take another two years and to be classified as a developed country, the per capita income will have to be at a minimum of USD 13,200 and that will take more than two decades of strong growth of between 8 to 9 per cent to achieve it.

Speaking at the 12th Convocation of ICFE Foundation for Higher education here, he said at aggregate output level, India is the 10th largest economy in the world now. That by itself is an impressive achievement. But in terms of per capita income, India's rank according to IMF is 142 out of 197 countries.

"The immediate focus of policymakers must be to raise the growth rate of the economy. Achievement of a USD 5 trillion economy is a good short term aspirational goal. This will take a minimum five years of sustained growth of 8 per cent. Even then, at the end of it, India's per capita income will be only USD 2472 and we will still be classified as a lower middle income country," he noted.

"We have thus to go a long way. This only shows we must certainly need to run fast," the former chairman, Economic Advisory Council to the Prime Minister said.

Post Covid-19 and post the Russia-Ukraine war, there is a need to lay down a clear roadmap for India's future development.

Initially, there is need to raise the growth rate to seven per cent and then follow it up with a growth rate of eight to nine per cent which is possible and India has shown in the past it can have that kind of growth rate over a sustained period of six to seven years, he said.

IRRI collaborates with IFHE in conducting study on diversification of cropping systems

Hyderabad, May 3 (ANI) International Rice Research Organization (IRRI) in collaboration with Hyderabad-based ICFAI Foundation for Higher Education (IFHE) is conducting a study on "Analysis of Padi Panchayats in Odisha: Potential to support inclusive, gender-responsive and climate-resilient diversification of cropping systems and livelihoods".

The study is conducted in three districts in Odisha - Bolangir, Mayurbhanj, and Ganjam, which have been chosen due to high poverty levels, vulnerability to droughts, and limited access to irrigation infrastructures, IFHE said in a release here on Wednesday.

The project is supervised by Prof. Subhanta Kumar Malapatra, Principal Investigator (PI), Department of Economics, ICFAI Business School (IBS) Hyderabad.

IRRI has been working in the state of Odisha since 2011 with the support of the Odisha state Department of Agriculture and Farmers Empowerment (DAFE), to contribute to achieving high and sustained system productivity with climate resilience, increased economic returns, risk reduction, and equitable distribution of the gains from productivity growth among small and marginal farmers, especially women.

However, IRRI's current research for development (R4D) interventions are focused mostly on farmers growing rice under complexly varied circumstances (with limited options for water management) using stress-tolerant rice varieties, the release said.

The World Bank (WB) aided project on "Odisha Integrated Irrigation Project for Climate Resilient Agriculture" under the Department of Water Resources, with an objective to test and promote high yielding and stress-tolerant crop varieties with appropriate, climate-smart management practices for tank irrigated areas and the inflow areas and facilitate women farmer entrepreneurship development based on seed business through collectives.

Padi Panchayats: In 2001, the Government of Odisha adopted a participatory irrigation management strategy or "Padi Panchayats" to promote the effective management of irrigation occurred by involving farmers and the community "in plan, operate, and maintain the irrigation system."

A study on the functioning and effectiveness of padi panchayats would, thus, throw light on the access and availability of irrigation that is critical to promote sustainable agriculture intensification.

However, RPL is susceptible to several routing attacks. Worst Parent Attack (WPA) is an attack against RPL in which a malicious node intentionally chooses a sub-optimal path to the root node to forward its data packets. This normalization leads, block normalized LMS (BNLMS) and block error normalized LMS (BENLMS) algorithms. Various adaptive artifact cancellers are developed in both time and frequency domains and applied on real TEB quantities contaminated with physiological signals. The ability of these techniques is measured by calculating signal to noise ratio improvement (SNRI), Excess Mean Square Error (EMSE), and Misadjustment (Mad). Among the considered algorithms, the frequency domain version of BENLMS algorithm removes the physiological artifacts effectively then the other counter parts. Hence, this adaptive artifact canceller is suitable for real time applications like wearable, remove health care monitoring units.

The hybridization of two algorithms like "Chicken Swarm Optimization (CSO), and Beetle Swarm Optimization (BSO) referred as Hybrid Beetle-Chicken Swarm Optimization (HBCSO)" is adopted for pruning the structure. The proposed hybrid algorithm attempts to identify the type of "sublattice of the initial lattice structure that has the smallest cumulated vertices" and satisfies the sustainment constraint. The validation of the suggested optimization is performed on various test cases and compares it over the traditional models to prove the efficiency of the introduced model in consuming less material for manufacturing lattice structure.

I.	Digital Transformation at Starbucks Knowledge, Category Winner in the Information and Communication Systems Management of The Case Centre's 33 rd global Awards and Competitions. Authored by Hadiya Faheem and Sanjib Dutta.	This case discusses the digital transformation initiatives at American multinational coffee giant Starbucks Corporation (Starbucks). The company offered a loyalty program known as the Starbucks Rewards program wherein customers registering for the program received a card to pay for their purchases at the stores. For every purchase, users earned stars, which they could later redeem for a free drink. This was followed by Starbucks launching its mobile app, which allowed the consumers to pay for their purchases using their smartphones at Starbucks stores. To enable consumers to pre-order and pay through their phones and pick up their items at Starbucks stores, Starbucks launched the Mobile Order & Pay feature, thus saving its consumers time. In 2017, the coffee giant integrated its rewards program, mobile order, payment, and personalization as part of its Digital Flywheel strategy that collected the order history of the consumers to make personalized recommendations to consumers through its smartphone app. Taking its digital initiatives forward, in 2017, Starbucks in association with American multinational technology giant Microsoft Corporation, launched Deep Brew, an Artificial Intelligence (AI) engine that offered customizable menu boards to drive-thru consumers wherein the engine suggested items based on the purchase history of consumers, time of day, weather, community preferences, popularity, store inventory, etc. In addition to this, Deep Brew automated time-consuming tasks such as management of inventory and did preventive maintenance of the company's espresso machines connected through Internet of Things (IoT). Analysts appreciated Starbucks for implementing several digital initiatives as part of its company philosophy and said these initiatives had helped it improve its sales and operational efficiency, enhance customer service, etc. Some critics pointed out that though the company's digital initiatives helped it survive the pandemic in its US stores and other global markets, Starbucks was facing declining sales in China – the company's second largest market after the US, due to Covid-19 related restrictions, Starbucks was facing increasing competition from Canadian coffee and doughnut chain Tims China, which was aggressively expanding in the country by opening its 300 th store in October 2021, and local Chinese coffee chain Luckin Coffee Inc. Industry analysts believed that Starbucks could cash in on the trend of work-from-home in China attributable to the Covid-19 pandemic, and increase its sales. Starbucks President and CEO Kevin Johnson remained optimistic about the growth of Starbucks in the US, China, and other global markets due to the company's digital-ecosystem and robust innovation pipeline, which would be rolled out in the coming months, thereby further enhancing the experience of consumers with Starbucks while increasing its sales and efficiency.

2.	Domino's Pizza: Business Continuity Strategy During the Covid-19 Pandemic, Overall Winner of The Case Centre's 33 rd global Awards and Competitions. Authored by Hadiya Faheem, and late Debapratim Purkayastha.	The case discusses the American multinational pizza giant Domino's Pizza, Inc.'s (Domino's) strategy during the Coronavirus pandemic in 2020. Domino's resorted to a 'contactless' delivery initiative, which it launched in January 2020 in the wake of the novel Covid-19 outbreak that started in Wuhan, China, and soon spread to countries across the world. With increasing awareness about the virus, consumers were taking precautions to prevent transmission of the disease and were remaining indoors. Many restaurants were closed and the governments of all countries allowed only takeout and delivery. Since Domino's had a strong delivery infrastructure and digital customer base who knew how to order online, it was well-positioned to tackle the crisis. Some analysts appreciated Domino's for its contactless delivery model as it was helping the pizza giant to thrive during the Covid-19 crisis. To cater to the increasing demand from consumers, Domino's was planning to hire 10,000 new workers in the US. However, it also attracted the ire of critics who felt that the company was putting its employees at risk of contracting the virus. There were also instances of some of its employees contracting Covid-19. With this being early days of the pandemic, some analysts opined that it could be a tough road ahead for Domino's as the company had to grapple with the full impact of the Covid-19 pandemic.
3.	Blueland: Is the Future Green? Won the second prize in the 2023 MBA ICC organized by John Molson School of Business, University of Concordia, Montreal, Canada. Authored by KBS Kumar and Indu Perepu.	The case is about New York-based eco-friendly refillable cleaning supply retailer Blueland was founded by serial entrepreneurs Sarah Paiji Yoo (Yoo) and John Mascari (Mascari) from Harvard Business School. Deeply concerned about the growing menace of microplastics, the founders wanted to bring home cleaning liquids, toilet cleaners, dishwashers, laundry wash, hand wash, etc. in a tablet / powder format, so that they can limit on packaging and transport. Blueland tablets and powders were 200 times smaller, 300 times lighter, 90 % cheaper to ship, and 30 times cheaper than conventional liquid cleaning products. Typically, a truck of Blueland tablets was equal to 83 trucks of liquid cleaning bottles. Since its launch in 2019 till February 2022, Blueland had introduced 15 different products. It sold more than 10 million products to over 1 million customers, and the company claimed that it had prevented more than 1 billion single-use plastic bottles from ending up in landfills and oceans. After tasting success with its cleaning and washing products, Blueland ventured into personal care and beauty products. Yoo was looking at launching a minimal assortment covering all essential products in personal care products. While cleaning products were easy-to-switch, personal care was a different matter altogether. In this segment, customers had strong affinities and preferences for brands. The competition was tremendous, and switching was not common. Blueland had been selling the products through its website and also a few e-commerce websites. Yoo and Mascari needed a plan to foray into retail and the highly competitive personal care and beauty products.
4.	Emma Walmsley – Can she cure GlaxoSmithKline?, Finalist prize in the 2023 MBA ICC organized by John Molson School of Business, University of Concordia, Montreal, Canada. Authored by Nagendra M.V and Indu Perepu.	Emma Walmsley (Walmsley), Chief Executive Officer (CEO) of leading British pharmaceutical company GlaxoSmithKline Plc (GSK), was facing one of the toughest challenges of her career and as a CEO. Walmsley, who had worked earlier with L'Oréal China, had assumed charge as the CEO of GSK, a £80 billion I company. She was the first woman CEO of a major pharma company. Walmsley had initiated several plans aimed at improving Research and Development activity at the company to produce new vaccines and drugs. But these new vaccines and drugs had not been introduced into the market on time. There was also a decline of around 15% in the share price of the company after she became a CEO. In June 2021, Walmsley in order to improve the efficiency of the overall business announced plans to restructure the business by spinning off the consumer healthcare business, and revitalizing the Drugs and Vaccine division, which she called New GSK. Though this plan was well appreciated by many investors and shareholders, there were a few who were not exactly happy with the direction in which GSK was going, and Walmsley needed their support to make her plan a success.
5.	Sumaira Latif at P&G: Pioneering Inclusive Design and Accessibility, won the second place in the Emerald Publishing Case for Women Competition. Authored by V. Namratha Prasad.	The case "Sumaira Latif at P&G: pioneering inclusive design and accessibility to all" provides an in-depth look at the efforts of Sumaira "Sam" Latif (she), Accessibility Leader at P&G, to incorporate inclusive design in the company's product packaging. Sam – a blind woman and mother of three – had always struggled to use various everyday products. Her personal struggles drove her to find ways to fix such problems for people with disabilities. So, after a decade of experience at P&G, when she got an opportunity to interact with the top management, she convinced them that catering to the disabled was not charity, but a smart business move. Sam also put forth the role she could play in helping P&G make products with an inclusive design. Impressed with her, P&G made her Special Consultant for Inclusive Design, a position specifically created for her. Sam created the widely lauded tactile indicators which helped the blind differentiate between shampoo and conditioner bottles. P&G then promoted her to the position of Company Accessibility Leader, wherein she played a pivotal role in bringing inclusive design to more of P&G's products. Sam also played a critical role in making P&G adopt certain technologies to help the blind shop for the company's products independently, apart from ensuring that all P&G ads were audio-described. However, Sam had an ambitious vision to infuse inclusive design into all products, which required her to bring about a culture change in the CPG industry. She was also faced with the predicament of how to ensure that audio-described ads became a media buying standard, considering the wide-scale resistance to it. How can Sam succeed in making the CPG industry develop inclusive design, the way she convinced P&G to do it?.
6.	"Temie Giwa-Tubosun of LifeBank: Creating the Future of Healthcare Supply Chain in Africa Powered by Technology" won the third place in the Emerald Publishing Case for Women Competition. Authored by Hadiya Faheem and Sanjib Dutta.	The case discusses how social entrepreneur Temie Giwa-Tubosun (Temie) founded LifeBank, a medical distribution company to provide access to blood, medical oxygen, and vaccines to hospitals in Nigeria. Temie's team developed SmartBank, an innovative blood bank which used blockchain technology and data science to guarantee safe access to blood to hospitals. By 2021, LifeBank had expanded to Kenya and Ethiopia. However, Temie faced a challenge in raising funds for scaling up her company as venture capitalists were hesitant to invest their money in women-backed businesses. To add to her troubles, African countries had poor infrastructure and a shortage of healthcare workers. Going forward, how would Temie and her team tackle the challenge of making the company's business model sustainable?

7.	<p>“Timnit Gebru: Seeking to Promote Diversity and Ethics in AI” won the fourth place in 2022 in the Emerald Publishing Case for Women Competition. Authored by Syeda Maseeha Qumer</p>	<p>The case discusses how Timnit Gebru (She), a prominent artificial intelligence (AI) researcher and former co-lead of the Ethical AI research team at Google, is leading the way in promoting diversity, inclusion, and ethics in AI. Gebru, one of the most high-profile Black women researchers, is an influential voice in the emerging field of ethical AI, which identifies issues based on bias, fairness, and responsibility. She is widely recognized as a pioneer in the field of facial recognition software and algorithmic discrimination.</p> <p>Gebru was fired from Google in December 2020 after the company asked her to retract a research paper she had co-authored about the pitfalls of Large Language Models (LLMs) and embedded racial and gender bias in AI. While Google maintained that Gebru had resigned, she said she had been fired from her job after she had raised issues of discrimination in the workplace and drawn attention to bias in AI. The ousting of the AI expert caused an uproar among thousands of Google employees who claimed that she had faced defensiveness, racism, research censorship, and retaliatory firing. On the heels of the removal of Gebru in February 2021, Google fired another co-lead of its AI ethics unit, Margaret Mitchell (She), claiming she had violated the company’s code of conduct. Both women had campaigned for more diversity at Google and raised concerns about censorship within the company. Gebru also cofounded Black in AI, a nonprofit that works to increase the inclusion, and visibility of Black people in the field of AI.</p> <p>In early December 2021, a year after being ousted from Google, Gebru launched an independent community-driven AI research organization called Distributed Artificial Intelligence Research (DAIR) to develop ethical AI, counter the influence of Big Tech in research and development of AI, and increase the presence and inclusion of Black researchers in the field of AI. The case discusses Gebru’s journey in creating DAIR, the goals of the organization, and some of the challenges she could face along the way. As Gebru seeks to increase diversity in the field of AI and reduce the negative impacts of bias in the training data used in AI models, the challenges before her would be to develop a sustainable revenue model for DAIR, influence AI policies and practices inside Big Tech companies from the outside, inspire and encourage more women to enter the AI field, and build a decentralized base of AI expertise.</p>
8.	<p>Rosalind Brewer – The Leadership Journey”, received the Honorable mention in the Emerald Publishing Case for Women Competition. Authored by K.B.S. Kumar and Indu Perepu</p>	<p>In March 2021, one of the largest drugstore chains in the USA, WBA, a US\$140bn company, announced that Rosalind Brewer (Brewer) (she) would be its new CEO. Brewer became the third black woman in history to lead a Fortune 500 company.</p> <p>Brewer graduated in Chemistry in 1984 and joined Kimberly-Clark as an organic chemist. From that role, she moved to other managerial positions and went on to lead the Global Nonwovens business. After spending 22 years at Kimberly-Clark, Brewer got an offer from Walmart to join the Company as Vice President. Though the position was below the President’s role she had held at Kimberly-Clark, she looked at it as a learning opportunity. She decided to join the Company, where she would be responsible for 140 stores. She then became the head of an operating division of over 1,600 stores. Within two years – in 2012 – she went on to head Sam’s Club, Walmart’s retail warehouse club. In 2017, she joined Starbucks as the head of operations. All through her career, Brewer remained a keen learner. Whenever she joined a new organization, she started by working in the field, working with truckers in Walmart, at the checkout counters in Sam’s Club or as a Barista at Starbucks caf_ es. This allowed her to learn the nuances of the businesses she went on to lead and change. As a strategic leader, she brought in several changes wherever she worked to reduce redundancies and smoothen operations. Being a hands-on leader, she regularly met the staff to take their opinions and ideas. She had healthy conversations with both young trainees and with staff members.</p> <p>At the same time, Brewer faced several challenges as a black woman in a leadership position. She said that she often had to justify her position due to her color. She advocated for diversity, equity and inclusion and strove to take diversity beyond just numbers. She stood her ground even when she faced several challenges and was even accused of being a racist when she spoke about the need for a diverse workforce among suppliers. She ensured that she had a highly diverse team with her and believed that diverse and inclusive teams made for a strong business.</p> <p>As the CEO of WBA, Brewer looked at taking medicines to the masses and ensuring availability and access to healthcare facilities to all. She was looking forward to bringing the public and private sectors together to make changes in society and strongly believed that CEOs were answerable not only to the company and its shareholders, but to the public and society at large.</p>
9.	<p>“Can Lisa Su Integrate AMDs Transformational Strategy and Culture Post Acquiring Xilinx and Pensando?”, received the Honorable mention in the Emerald Publishing Case for Women Competition. Authored by Shwetha Kumari and Jitesh Nair.</p>	<p>The case study describes how Lisa Su (Lisa), the first woman CEO of AMD, helped turn around the debt laden semiconductor firm in a few years. The case focuses upon Lisa’s early life and education and the influence of her parents in shaping her personality. In the early part of Lisa’s career, she worked on individual roles in semiconductor projects and in research and product development. She then made the gradual shift to a people management role after moving to IBM followed by a leadership opportunity at Freescale Semiconductor Inc.</p> <p>Lisa moved to AMD in 2012 as Senior Vice President and General Manager of the company’s global business divisions at a time when AMD was nearly US\$2.5 billion in debt and revenues had increased only once in the previous five years. The case looks at how Lisa put in place an action plan to tackle the key problem areas through a ‘Three-Pronged Rejuvenation Approach’. She took the helm at AMD as its CEO in 2014 and successfully executed a multi-year strategy that significantly re-shaped the company’s product portfolio and customer set and delivered industry-leading growth. By 2016, AMD had become the number one provider of graphics technology for home game consoles and had captured the #1 market share for thin clients. Lisa’s leadership approach laid emphasis on relationships, learning, and teamwork as well as mentoring other key women leaders within AMD.</p> <p>AMD began 2022 with two major acquisition, the US\$49-billion acquisition of Xilinx, and the US\$1.9-billion planned acquisition of Pensando. However, it remains to be seen whether Su would be able to successfully communicate and integrate AMDs vision and values, which she had built over the last eight years, with Xilinx and Pensando?</p>

Airbnb: Beating Covid-19 Induced Existential Crisis through Online Experiences won the 'Best Case' Award at the Case Colloquium organized by the Faculty of Management Studies and Research, Aligarh Muslim University. Authored by Faria Zafar and Indu Perepu	<p>The US-based Airbnb Inc. (Airbnb), an online home rental company that connected people who wanted to rent out their homes with those who were looking for accommodation in specific locales, faced a disruption in its business due to Covid-19. People were not using home rental services as traveling had come to a standstill in the wake of COVID-19 imposed travel restrictions and shelter-in-place orders imposed by governments across the world. This not only hurt Airbnb, but also more than 4 million hosts in over 220 countries and regions and approximately 100,000 cities who put up their properties for rent on Airbnb.</p> <p>Airbnb had introduced an initiative in 2016 called Airbnb Experiences, under which locals in the area offered tours and other activities to guests. This segment of Airbnb also was hit hard due to the pandemic. Like many other organizations, Airbnb was thinking of ways to innovate its business to mitigate the impact of the disruptions caused by the pandemic.</p> <p>Many of those who had hosted Airbnb Experiences suggested taking the experiences online. So, finally in April 2020, Airbnb came up with an online version of its Experiences. Airbnb Online Experiences were live video sessions hosted by experts. The experts would either teach skills like cooking, baking, or dancing or there would be virtual tours run by locals in any area.</p> <p>Airbnb Online Experiences started with 50 virtual experiences. By August 2020, there were more than 700 online experiences available on the Airbnb website. New experiences were added every day. The experiences became an instant hit with people suffering from boredom due to the lockdowns and social distancing norms. Though there were some already existing businesses offering similar experiences, the response to Airbnb Online Experiences was overwhelming for the company as well as the hosts.</p>

Sea6 Energy: Sustainable Ocean Farming for a Sustainable Bioeconomy, winner of 1 st Annual Case Research Competition – 2021 - Connecting Academia Industry Communities conducted by K J Somaiya Institute of Management. Authored by Shwetha Kumari and Jitesh Nair	<p>The case study describes the efforts of Sea6 Energy, a deep tech company, to research, develop, and patent products and processes that supported and promoted sustainable farming practices. Sea6 was founded in July 2010 by four engineering students under the mentorship of Shrikumar Suryanarayan, former R&D head of Biocon, and an adjunct faculty at the IIT Madras. The case first discusses the deep tech ecosystem in India. It then touches upon the early journey of the founding team and their search for ideas to come up with a technology to carry out large-scale agriculture on the sea using sea-plants to produce enough marine biomass that could be converted to biofuel and how this finally led to the inception of Sea6. The case then describes the efforts made and the challenges faced by the team to get funding and develop products that were sustainable.</p> <p>The case further emphasizes the continuing efforts of Sea6 to come up with patents for products from sea plants, including biofuels and biostimulants, and how it subsequently developed SeaCombine – the World's First-Ever Sea Tractor – and Dweep, an artificial floating island system that would enable Sea6 to scale up production and achieve commercial viability. This was critical since profitability was dependent on scaling up production and looking at ways to increase the scope of the application of seaweed products.</p> <p>The case finally focuses on the market for biostimulants and ocean farming processes and the challenges Sea6 could face when it begins scaling up production and how this could result in the company finding it difficult to retain its connections with the scientific institutions when it moves out of the research cluster. The big question is on how well the founders are able to make the transition from the technical area of research and product development to the business aspects of scaling-up, growth, revenues, and profitability.</p>
12.	"StopPalu: Advancing Community-focused Fight against Malaria in Guinea", winner of the Glendal E. and Alice D. Wright Prize Fund for Conflict and Collaboration Case Studies in International Development. Authored by Benudhar Sahu and Indu Perepu.	<p>Before 2013, the African country Guinea was facing a public health crisis due to the high prevalence of malaria, which put a burden on the country, one of the poorest in the world. In spite of the government's efforts, the spread of malaria could not be controlled. In order to address this issue, USAID launched a project called StopPalu in 2013. This was funded by the US President's Malaria Initiative (PMI) and implemented by RTI International. A community focused project, StopPalu provided capacity building support to local people and health workers to prevent, diagnose, and treat malaria. In 2017, a follow-on project called StopPalu+ was started to provide multiple interventions for prevention, diagnosis, and treatment of malaria. This was done in collaboration with NGOs and community based organizations. The Stop Palu+ project was slated to end in 2022, after which the government of Guinea needed to take it forward. This case is about the implementation of the StopPalu project and explains how collaborative partnership and a community-focused approach were followed to find a solution to the problem of malaria in Guinea.</p>
