6. Events Organized By Managers without Borders

Edify 2024 – Knowledge Sharing Session

The session "Edify" organized by Managers Without Borders at IBS Hyderabad on 04/07/2024 aimed at educating junior members batch 0f 2026 on fundamental topics in accounting was successfully conducted. This report highlights the key aspects and outcomes of the session.



Session Overview:

The session focused on imparting essential concepts in financial literacy, with a particular emphasis on practical skills such as budgeting, financial planning, and understanding economic transactions. The objective was to equip participants with foundational knowledge that is crucial for navigating the complexities of financial management.

Content Covered:

- Introduction to Accounting Principles: Basic principles governing financial transactions and reporting were explained to provide a solid framework.
- Journal: In accounting, a journal iwhere all financial transactions of a business are first recorded in chronological order. It's like a detailed diary of every transaction, such as sales, purchases, expenses, and payments. Each entry in the journal includes the date, the accounts involved, a brief description, and the amounts debited and credited. The journal serves as the foundation for the entire accounting process, providing a record that is later summarized and transferred into the general ledger for further analysis and reporting. Essentially, it's where all the financial activities of a business are documented step-by-step before being organized into more structured financial statements.
- Ledger: The ledger is like a master record book where all the financial transactions of a business are classified and summarized. It contains separate accounts for different types of





transactions, such as sales, purchases, expenses, assets, and liabilities. Each account in the ledger shows the details of transactions related to that specific category. For example, the sales ledger will list all sales transactions, the purchases ledger will list all purchases, and so on.

- Subsidiary books Subsidiary books are specialized journals used to record similar types of transactions together in a summarized manner before they are posted to the general ledger. They are also known as sub-ledgers. Common subsidiary books include:
- Inventory valuation: About different types of valuation of inventory followed in India such as FIFO, Weighted average cost, and specific identification method. All these were clearly explained by illustrating some examples and interacting with them for doubts clarification

Practical Applications: Real-world examples and case studies were utilized to illustrate how theoretical knowledge translates into practical scenarios.

Methodology:

The session utilized a combination of presentations, interactive discussions, and practical exercises to engage participants actively. This approach ensured that theoretical concepts were reinforced through practical applications, enhancing comprehension and retention.

Outcome:

Participants demonstrated a keen interest and engagement throughout the session, actively participating in discussions and exercises. Feedback indicated a significant improvement in understanding foundational accounting principles and practical skills essential for financial management.

Impact:

The initiative not only facilitated knowledge sharing but also fostered a culture of learning and mentorship within the organization. By empowering junior members with essential financial skills, the session contributed to their professional development and preparedness to handle financial responsibilities effectively.



INTRODUCTORY EVENT: GRENZENLOUS 8.0

On August 07, 2024, the Managers Without Borders (MWB) Student Chapter at IBS Hyderabad organized an Introductory Event. The event was a mix of learning, enjoyment, and friendly competition, designed to introduce participants to key topics while keeping the energy high. The event consisted of two primary rounds and a couple of fun filler games.



Round 1: Crossword Challenge

On a digital board, there was a crossword puzzle to solve in the first round. The first round featured a **crossword search** displayed on a digital board. Participants were tasked with searching for words hidden in a grid, with all words related to five main themes: **energy, employment, economy, entrepreneurship, and environment**. The teams worked together to find as many relevant words as possible within a limited time. This round was both fun and educational, as it challenged participants to quickly identify key terms connected to these important themes.









Filler Rounds: Fun Games

To add an element of fun between the competitive rounds, we introduced two filler games:

- 1. Head, Shoulders, Knees, and Bottle: In this game, participants followed commands to touch their head, shoulders, or knees. When the word "bottle" was called out, they had to grab a bottle placed in front of them quickly. The first person to grab the bottle won the game.
- 2. Guess the Word: Two participants played together in this game. One participant wore headphones with loud music playing, while the other tried to communicate a word or phrase. The participant with the headphones had to guess what was being said by reading lips or body language





Round 2: Mind Scribble

The second round, called **Mind Scribble** was a Google Form-based quiz. Participants were asked questions related to the same five key themes as in the first round. This round tested participants' in-depth understanding of these topics, allowing them to showcase their knowledge in a more structured format. The questions prompted them to think critically about current issues in energy, employment, economy, entrepreneurship, and the environment.







Sustainability: Solving Global Problems Together, As Individuals

Guest Speaker Profile : Mr. Vinodh Valluri, Sustainability Professional & Senior Consultant at Cappemini Invent. (Masters in Environmental and Earth Science, The University of Texas at Arlington). With 15+ Years of extensive experience in the field of sustainability.

On the occasion of Earth Day - 22, April, 2024. This guest lecture was organized by Managers without Borders, the official student chapter of IBS Hyderabad.



Let us share with you the invaluable insights from the guest lecture discussions.

Thirty years ago, our ecosystems were teeming with life—birds chirped in the morning, insects buzzed around flowers, and nature hummed with vitality. Today, however, this symphony of life is fading into silence. The collapse of insect and bird populations has sounded an alarm, a warning that our actions have consequences. But who is responsible for this ecological crisis? And how can we, as individuals and as a collective, steer ourselves back onto the path of harmony with nature?

Responsibility and Awareness:

It's easy to point fingers and assign blame, but the truth is that responsibility lies with all of us. While the lower 50% of the population may account for only 10% of lifestyle emissions, every choice we make, no matter how small, contributes to the state of our planet. The first step towards change is awareness—recognizing the impact of our actions on the delicate balance of ecosystems.





Reimagining Natural Civilizations:

To find a way forward, we must look back. Before the rise of industrialization and mass consumption, there existed civilizations that lived in harmony with nature. They understood that their existence was woven into the fabric of the natural world, not separate from it. We can learn from their wisdom and re-imagine our societies as interconnected with, rather than dominant over, nature.

The Urgency of Action:

Time is not on our side. The collapse of insect and bird populations is just the beginning of a much larger ecological crisis. We must act swiftly and decisively to unbuild the farce of our current unsustainable practices and revive the real path towards a sustainable future. But how much time do we have? The answer is simple: very little. The window of opportunity is closing rapidly, and each day of inaction brings us closer to irreversible damage.

While individual choices are important, they are not enough on their own. We must also come together as communities and demand worldwide change. However, individual actions serve as the building blocks of collective movements. Here are some ways in which we can contribute on an individual level:

Reduce Consumption: Consume less, choose products with minimal environmental impact, and opt for sustainable alternatives whenever possible.

Support Biodiversity: Create habitats for birds and insects in your backyard, plant native species, and avoid the use of pesticides.

Advocate for Change: Raise awareness about environmental issues, support policies and initiatives that promote sustainability, and hold corporations and governments accountable for The collapse of insect and bird populations serves as a stark reminder of the consequences of our actions. However, it also presents an opportunity for reflection and change. "EMPOWER YOUR VISION: NAVIGATING THE ENTREPRENEURIAL JOURNEY FROM IDEA TO IMPACT"



Celebrating World Entrepreneurs' Day 2024

On August 21, 2024, the Managers Without Borders (MWB) Student Chapter at IBS Hyderabad organized a **Guest lecture** in celebration of World Entrepreneurs' Day. This day is globally recognized to honour entrepreneurs who drive innovation, leadership, and progress. The event aimed to inspire students by offering insights into the entrepreneurship journey and bridging the gap between academic knowledge and real-world business challenges.

Our Chapter at IBS Hyderabad marked this occasion with a compelling guest lecture by **Mr. Abhilekh Verma**, an accomplished startup mentor and industry leader in recruitment, upskilling, and AI/ML ventures. With over 70+ Gen AI Global Sessions and years of hands-on experience, Mr. Verma delivered invaluable insights to aspiring entrepreneurs.



Opening Snippets from the Guest Lecture



The lecture opened with Mr. Verma's personal story of transitioning from his leadership role at KPMG to founding his own AI/ML startup. He shared how receiving 3,500 resumes in a year, mostly for referral requests, prompted him to create a solution that could bridge job seekers with recruiters through AI and machine learning technologies. His experience of shifting from the security of a corporate environment to the unpredictability of entrepreneurship resonated with many in the audience.

One of the central themes of the discussion was the challenge of building a competent team in the early stages of a startup. Mr. Verma candidly spoke about how, in contrast to the structured support at KPMG, he had to start from scratch as an entrepreneur. When he posted a hiring notice for AI/ML interns, he received over 320 applications in a single day. Navigating this overwhelming response and onboarding the right talent proved to be one of his biggest early hurdles. An important piece of advice Mr. Verma shared was the need for a strong differentiator when starting a company. His vision was to build something that could compete with LinkedIn by addressing one of its key shortcomings—the lack of timely updates when a recruiter rejects a candidate. He encouraged students to explore AI tools to identify pain points in industries and use those insights to develop innovative business ideas.



One of the most impactful takeaways from the session was Mr. Verma's perspective on rejection. He shared how he faced rejection from 12 different incubators before being selected, reinforcing the idea that resilience in the face of setbacks is crucial for any entrepreneur. This lesson, he suggested, applies not only to entrepreneurship but also to broader life challenges like placements and career decisions. Reflecting on his own MBA experience, Mr. Verma noted how juggling between multiple responsibilities—studies, clubs, family, and relationships—helped him build resilience and time management skills, essential traits for any entrepreneur. He also credited the case studies he encountered during his MBA for providing real-life problem-solving frameworks that he applies to his business today.

Mr. Verma urged students to be thoughtful before diving into full-time entrepreneurship. He encouraged them to be risk-takers but also emphasized the importance of knowing one's own motivations. Entrepreneurship, he explained, isn't a path to pursue just because it's trendy; it requires a genuine commitment and passion for solving problems.





In response to a question about handling failures, Mr. Verma reiterated the need for resilience. His message was clear: learn from setbacks, but do not let them define your future efforts. Persistence, he noted, is the key to eventually succeeding in any venture. Towards the end of the lecture, Mr. Verma discussed his inspiration for writing his book, which focuses on helping introverts step out of their comfort zones. Being an introvert himself, he shared how he worked consistently to overcome this challenge and how his book aims to guide others on a similar journey of self-development.

As the session drew to a close, the students gained a well-rounded understanding of entrepreneurship—not just the glamorous successes but also the challenges, risks, and hardwon lessons that come with it. The Q&A session allowed participants to engage with Mr. Verma on a personal level, leaving them with valuable takeaways for their entrepreneurial ambitions.

Save Water, Save Electricity Campaign 2024

The "Save Water, Save Electricity" campaign was organized at IBS Hyderabad on the 20th & 21st of June 2024 in collaboration with IBS Messenger to promote sustainability and resource conservation among students, faculty, and staff. The campaign aimed to raise awareness about conserving water and electricity while encouraging behavioral changes that reduce resource consumption. The initiative focused on creating a culture of sustainability within the campus community.



The campaign strategically targeted key locations within the academic blocks to achieve its objectives, including lecture halls, classrooms, drinking water coolers, washrooms, and common areas. In these locations, visually appealing stickers with messages like "Save Water, Save Life" and "Turn Off Lights When Not in Use" were placed near taps, water coolers, and light switches to remind everyone of the need to conserve resources.









In addition to sticker placement, the campaign engaged students in interactive discussions about their daily habits and how they could contribute to saving water and electricity. A group of students also visited key faculty members, including Prof Mrs. Madhavi, the student's activity coordinator, the Dean, and the Director, urging them to pledge support for the initiative. This engagement with leadership helped garner further support for the campaign's goals.
