






Founder's Profile

Mr. N. J. Yasaswy (1950-2011), founder of the ICFAI Group of educational institutions and a pioneer in promoting higher education in the private sector had a brilliant academic career: B.Com (Andhra University 1969 - First Rank), CA Inter (May 1971 – First Rank), CA Final (May 1973 – First Rank), ICWA Inter (July 1970 – First Rank) and ICWA Final (July 1972 – First Rank). He was the recipient of the Basu Foundation Award for the Best Student of the Year from both – The Institute of Cost and Works Accountants of India (in 1972) and The Institute of Chartered Accountants of India (in 1973).



Mr. Yasaswy set up the ICFAI as a single institute in 1985 without governmental sops or institutional funding, in an era where government support was the norm. He chose to spend all his energy on the fledgling institution which over the years grew to become a monument to what ambition can deliver. He was instrumental in building several business schools and universities in the developing states of India, particularly in the North-East region. He stood for professional management, excellence in the quality of education offered in the ICFAI institutions, and absolute discipline.

He was charismatic, a great teacher, an institution builder, a visionary and a genius who was years ahead of his time. His vision will continue to guide ICFAI forever.



Admission Modalities

BBA-LLB (Hons.) & BA(J)-LLB (Hons.)



Eligibility

Pass in Class XII or equivalent with an aggregate of 50% and above marks in single attempt (any discipline) in English medium.

▶ Class XII (or equivalent) students who appeared for their final examinations before July 01, 2025 and awaiting for results are also eligible to apply.

The admission of applicants will, however, remain provisional until final mark-sheets establishing their eligibility are submitted.

The last date for submitting the proof of Class XII (or equivalent) marksheet is September 01, 2025, failing which the provisional admission will automatically stand cancelled and forfeit the fee paid.

Age

Applicants should not be more than 21 years of age as on the day of commencement of the Semester I, ie., July 28, 2025. However, the changes if any made to age limit by the BCI from time to time will be followed. Date of birth as recorded in the Secondary School Certificate will be taken as authentic.

Teaching & Learning

The learning at ICFAI Law School is multi-dimensional in addition to classroom teaching. A host of activities like Assignments, Moot Courts, Clinical Courses, Legal Aids, Immersion Workshops, Seminars/Workshops, Internships, Extra-curricular Activities etc., are designed to sharpen the domain knowledge of legal profession.

The ICFAI Law School has a unique and innovative approach to legal education that focuses on providing the right knowledge and skills for enduring success in legal careers. As practice precedes theory, more emphasis is placed on the conceptual understanding and application of law. Learning at ICFAI Law School aims to sharpen the professional skills, organizing skills, interpersonal skills and practical learning of a student, through various learning tools like clinical courses, internships, legal aid clinics and court visits.

Internships: The internships form an important component of law education at ICFAI Law School. It is an attempt to bridge the gap between the professional world and academic institutions. Internship introduces students to real-life situations. Students are encouraged to take up assignments, which are multi-disciplinary, goal-oriented, time bound and involve teamwork. Students of BBA-LLB (Hons.)/ BA(J)-LLB (Hons.) Program undertake the internship program at the end of each year during the summer holidays. The students are sent to the law firms, corporates, advocates, offices of judges of the High Courts and Supreme Court, NGOs, Consumer Courts, etc., to gain practical knowledge.

Student Centric Approach:

The ICFAI Law School has student centric approach in designing the curriculum of its five years integrated law programs. The programs are blend of theory and practice with an option for student to select the electives of their choice among the alternatives. Thus, it prompts the student to select the courses of

their choices from a pool of courses of business laws, constitutional law, international law, intellectual property laws and other law courses and management courses. It offers few courses in foreign languages to make the student flexible to undertake work/ practice belonging to that country. These selected courses provides the extended skill-sets and advanced knowledge base. Professional enhancement courses like legal drafting, ADR Clinics, Legal Aid Projects are compulsory courses which enhance lawyering and advocacy skill sets.

Self-Study/Seminar Courses:

The ICFAI Law School is offering Selfstudy and Seminar courses to its students. Every student, in addition to the regular courses of the program, may opt for one or two Self study courses during a semester which are Non-Letter Graded courses. The Student during his/her tenure in the law school, may elect one or two courses from the list of the courses provided by the law school. There will not be any regular class work for the said courses. However, a Faculty will be allocated for the courses, the student may consult the said faculty for guidance for completing the course. The student is required to give two seminar presentations for the course to a panel of experts for evaluation of the study of the course and for allotting the Non-Letter Grade to the students which will be reflected on the Grade Sheet issued by the University.

The Self study /Seminar Course help the students for better credits, augmentation of the focused and specialized knowledge, helps in selflearning process which is a core skill for a accomplished lawyers. Students also can exercise the independent thinking ability which is very important in study. Self study activity is more effective than the teaching by others. Self-study and Seminar courses enrich the students research skills, understanding and assimilating the subject matter, and sharpens the presentation skills.

Once the student selects one subject for the Self-study/Seminar course in a semester with the approval of the Academic Coordinator, it cannot be changed or discontinued for any reason unless approved by the Director of the Law School.

Clinical Courses and Legal Aid Projects Court Visits

The students are taken to various courts like High Court, Civil Court, Criminal Court, Family Court and Tribunals, accompanied by the Faculty to enable them to observe the proceedings in the court to learn the court craft and practical part of the legal education.

Guest Lectures: Eminent academicians and practicing legal professionals are invited for guest lectures wherein students get to understand the applications of various laws and management concepts and ideas. Guest lectures are considered as significant learning tools as the students note the experiences of legal professionals directly.
